#### **Statistics**

The Action Group for Palestinians of Syria announced, in its detailed documentary report, which was issued today, that the number of Palestinian refugees victims in Syria has reached 2535 victims who were killed due to the ongoing events in Syria according to its documented statistics till the end of October 2014.

According to the Group, 2494 Palestinian refugees were killed inside Syria and 41 outside, as 1707 Palestinian refugees were killed inside Palestinian camps and compounds in Syria. 41 Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria, 27 of them were drawn while trying to reach European countries to escape from the tragic situations in Syria and 2 of them were killed due to the Israeli occupation bombing that targeted civilian houses in Gaza strip.

The documentation team in the Action Group noted that this report is concerned with documented the Palestinian refugees victims statistics in Syria till the end of October 2014and the group is not concerned about determining the identity of the offender directly.

#### **Victims**

The young man Mohammed Nayef Matto from the Yarmouk camp was killed due to torture in the Syrian regime prisons.

The young man Ahmed Mustafa Al Khateib from Al Aedein camp was also killed due to torture in the Syrian regime prisons after being detained for three years.

The old woman Nabila Abu Swereih, was born on 1949, lives at Al Orouba neighborhood in the Yarmouk camp, and was killed due to the siege and the lack of medical care. She also suffers from diabetes and high blood pressure in addition to kidney failure.

### **Recent Updates**

A state of tension prevailed Khan Al Sheih camp for Palestinian refugees due to the bombing that targeted the adjacent areas with explosive barrels, which resulted in very loud explosion sounds inside the camp. The severe shortage in medical services and supplies is still continuous due to the repeated closure of the roads that link the camp with the surrounding areas.

Two women were killed in the Yarmouk camp south of the Syrian capital Damascus, due to the siege and the lack of medical care. The victims are:

Huda Daher Mohammed, was born on 1973 from the Yarmouk camp, Syrian, and the other one is Nabila Abu Swereih, was born on 1949, lives at Al Orouba neighborhood in the Yarmouk camp, Nabila died due to having diabetes and high blood pressure in addition to kidney failure.

The death of the two women has raised the number of victims who were killed in the Yarmouk camp due to siege and lack of medical care to 157 victims. In another hand, the distribution of food and medical aids, provided by the UNRWA to the residents of the Yarmouk camp, was resumed yesterday morning for the second day respectively.

Meanwhile, a family has managed to enter the camp after the approval of the Syrian security, while thousands of Palestinian families are still waiting outside the camp to return back to their houses in the besieged camp for 497 days. In southern Syria, the residents of Al Muzeireeb town in the province of Daraa, that is inhabitant by about 8500 Palestinian refugees, are living a state of tension and boiling because of the continued bombing with explosive barrels that led to a number of casualties among civilians.

It is noteworthy that, on Sunday 09.02.2014, a large explosion was heard at Al Muzareib town as a result of the warplanes bombing with explosive Barrels near Traan UNRWA School, which is resulted in injuring about 40 students in addition to four of the school staff. on 18-2-2014, a horrific massacre was committed in Al Muzaireib compound due to the explosive barrels that targeted Ain Al Zaytoun UNRWA School and its health clinic while the students were inside the school, which led to more than 15 Palestinian victims.

In the same context, the echoes of violent clashes and explosion sounds were heard across Khan Dannon camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus suburb, the sounds were resulted of the battles between the Syrian opposition and the regular army forces on the crossing of Al Teiba town adjacent to the camp.

#### Lebanon

Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon, at Sheikh Ibrahim Siddiq Hall in the city of Sidon, on Thursday, 11.13.2014, held a medical awareness lecture titled Night bedwetting in children (causes, prevention, treatment).

On the other hand, the Office of Refugee Affairs of Hamas, presented 1,500 USD to Lahfa Endowment for Preaching and Charitable Work, as a contribution in the distribution of bread monthly rations in Nahr Al-Bared refugee camp, which includes about 400 Palestinian families displaced from Syria to Nahr al-Bared.

#### Civil Work Committees

The volunteer team at Jafra Foundation continued to provide relief services to the people of the Yarmouk camp who are besieged for about 497 days respectively, where the services team in Jafra held a campaign of reclamation and operation of four artesian wells inside the camp.

The team also fixes two pumps to be used to extract water, as five water storage points were established, especially in areas that far from the available water sources, in addition to the water disinfection in order to become drinkable, with the aim of alleviating the suffering of the camp's residents who complain about the continued water cut for homes and lanes for more than two months.



### The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics

- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 497 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 580 days, water was cut for 67 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 157 victims.
- 41 Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria.
- 94 PLA members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 399 days respectively.

- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 368 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 568 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 214 days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
- Khan Danoun Camp: Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- Al Nairab Camp: Power is still cut for more than a year.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Ca mps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
