Latest Developments

Despite their tragedy, suffering and dire living, economic and legal conditions, in which no solution has been offered to alleviate the burden of their suffering off of themselves and their families, the determination of the Palestinian-Syrian students in Lebanon to excel, succeed and follow up on their academic and educational achievements has not been affected. Palestinian student "Bisan Essam Khazaay," who was displaced from Sayeda Zeinab camp to Lebanon, achieved first place in the Basic Education Certificate exam for 2018 in her school, "Al-Abrar Educational Center," located in Joub Jannine, in the western Beqaa.

"Ismaeil Osama Aly," from Yarmouk camp, passed the Basic Education Certificate of the Year (2018) with a 'good' grade, despite the difficulties and suffering he faced, after his father fled on a death boat to a European country, in order to secure a life of dignity for his family. Although he experienced very harsh days, he managed to defeat this feeling and continued his education with great ambition, until he excelled and succeeded.

Meanwhile, "Doaa Mohammed Al-Beqaay," from Yarmouk camp, who succeeded in the Basic Education Certificate of the Year (2018), was ranked first on UNRWA's Jarmak school in the Bekaa region with a good grade, while Palestinian student "Ayat Khaled Abd El-Fattah," who was displaced from the town of Chebaa to Lebanon, passed the Basic Education Certificate of the Year (2018), with an excellent rate.

Among the most prominent names were Jala Khalid Al Khatib, the daughter of Yarmouk camp, who succeeded with an excellent grade, and ranked first in Beit Jala School in Siblin, South of Lebanon, in eighth grade. Her brother Jawad Khalid Al Khatib achieved first place in the second grade primary level in the city of Sidon, Al-Kharoub region and Beir Zeit School in SIblin. He also came sixth place in Lebanon.

The Palestinian-Syrian students in Lebanon faced great difficulties and obstacles that prevented them from attending schools, represented by their deteriorating economic and legal situations, due to their lack of regular residence in Lebanon, as well as differences between the Syrian curricula and the Lebanese ones, where the latter depends on a foreign language in teaching, in contrary to the Syrian curriculum. The deterioration of the security situation inside the camps also affected the quality of education received by the Palestinian students in Lebanon.

In the south, the Syrian regime forces targeted the road between the town of Muzayrib and the city of Tafs in south Syria with a number of artillery shells, which led to the spread of panic



and chaos among the civilians, as a result of the new military escalation.

In the same context, panic and fear spread, especially among children, after an unknown explosion in the skies of the Muzayrib area and around the south of Syria, according to our correspondent in Deraa.

The correspondent of the Action Group reported that the "Israeli occupation" army targeted a Patriot missile at a Syrian reconnaissance aircraft belonging to the Syrian regime, noting that parts of the plane fell on the suburbs of the town of Zizoun, which is located 5 km away from Tal Shehab.

1,700 Palestinian families in Muzayrib suffer from extremely harsh living conditions, due to the scarcity of aid, the high prices and the spread of unemployment.

In south Damascus, an Irish parliamentary delegation organized an inspection visit to Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees, accompanied by the military commander of the Free Palestine Movement, Saeed Abd El-Aal, to find out the extent of the destruction and devastation, caused to the homes and properties of civilians, as a result of the shelling and the violent clashes that broke out between the Syrian regime forces on the one hand and Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham on the other.

The forces of the Syrian regime regained control of Yarmouk camp and areas in the south of Damascus on 21-05-2018, after the military operation launched on the 19th of April 2018, in which all kinds of air and ground weapons were used.





In Germany, the Palestinian-Syrian refugee "Kinda Walid Al Hassan" was able to achieve first place at the level of her school in the German city of Sinzig, which includes a number of Arab and German students, after receiving full marks.

Kinda, the daughter of Al-Aedin camp in Homs, who fled the hell of war in Syria years ago to Germany to seek security and safety, was able, in a short period, to integrate with the new society, learn its language and excel over the students.
