Latest Developments

The Turkish and Jordanian authorities continue to prevent Palestinian refugees from Syria from entering the country, in contravention of international treaties.

Turkey has also suspended granting visas to Palestinian refugees from Syria for over three years. An official decision by Jordan has banned the Palestinians of Syria from entering the country, no matter the reason.

At the same time, the Lebanese authorities and border police have tightened grip on Palestinians attempting to enter the country.



In another development, Residents of AlSebeina Camp for Palestinian refugees in Rif Dimashq have been denied access to their homes via government-run checkpoints since November 7, 2013.

Bloody hostilities between the government troops and the opposition battalions in and around AlSbeina forced dozens of families to seek shelter elsewhere. The clashes culminated in a tighter cordon by the regime squads on all corners of the shelter.

According to eye-witnesses, 80% of AlSbeina buildings have been subjected to quasi-total destruction, particularly in the area stretching from Muadh Ibn Jabal Mosque to the Kurds Oven, which makes the western entrance to the shelter. Homes of opposition affiliates have been burned down.



Meanwhile, AGPS researchers found out that 80% of Palestinians from Syria have lost their jobs in the rampant warfare.

Several children dropped out of school as they sought livelihoods to help feeding and sheltering their impoverished families, most of whom have been forced to pay rental fees of up to \$150 per month.

Pro-government militias have made use of the dire situation in Syria to push Palestinian youths into military conscription for a monthly income that barely exceeds \$75.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugees from Syria sheltered on Greek islands have sounded distress signals over the exacerbated humanitarian conditions they have been subjected to.

Palestinian refugees in Greece have been enduring medical neglect and poor hygiene, along with the lack of relief assistance and the propagation of poisonous reptiles in the makeshift tents they have been locked up in.

Some 400 Palestinian refugees, mostly from the Syrian camps of Daraa, Yarmouk, AlAydeen, and AlHusseiniya, have been stranded in makeshift tents and under-equipped halls on such Greek islands as Lesbos, Chios, Leros, and Kos.

Palestinians of Syria: July 15, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,526 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,615 Palestinian refugees, including 101 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,452 days in a row.
- 196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,188 and 1,037 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,532 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 266 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria fled to Europe until the end of 2016.

- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
