Libya

The Action Group received news about the detention of 8 Palestinians of Syria Refugees in Libya while they were heading from Ibn Al Waleed area to Zuwara area, and till this moment there is no news about them. In the same context, the Palestinians of Syria in Libya are suffering of the increasing of the arrest and kidnap which they are exposed to. On 6/9/2014, 17 Syrian Palestinians were kidnapped in the Libyan Ajdabiya after stealing all what they have of money where the kidnapers released them after paying the ransom. An Unknown Armed Group detained 15 Syrian Palestinians and Syrians youth on August 2014 in Maleta besides Zuwara.

Solidarity Campaigns

A number of Palestinian activists launched, on the social media website Facebook, a campaign titled as "Saleh Mawed, You are Not Alone, We are All with You" to put pressure on the German authorities to accept giving him a permission to enter its lands to complete his treatment. According to one of the activists who participated in Launching the campaign said "it is right that the campaign hold a name but it is screaming on the face of everybody who showed carelessness towards the Syrian Palestinians specially the injured who lost every hope to secure treatment, they are many and Saleh is one of them"

It is mentioned that Saleh Waed from the Yarmouk camp was working as a Sergeant assistant in the Palestine hospital in the camp and he was injured on 13/12/2013 by mortal shell shrapnel while he was trying to rescue one of his relatives and her children after their house was exposed to bombing where he was immediately taken to AL Basel hospital in the camp but the targeting of the hospital prevented him to get into it, then they sent him to Faeyz Halawa hospital and then to Al Mojtahed hospital and to Omayya hospital in Damascus where he stayed there for about 18 days and had a spine surgery and stayed under the intensive care for 24 hours but his injury was dangerous and led to Hemiplegia. Victims

Ahmed Ali Saleh, from Khan Danoun camp and a PLA member, died due to clashes that broke out in Damascus Suburb which raises the victims toll, amongst the PLA and who were documented by the Action Group, to 95 victims.

Statistics

According to the statistics of the Action Group for Palestinians of Syria, 2494 Palestinian victims were documented inside Syria till the end of October 2014, where 1116 died in Damascus in addition to 679 refugees died in Damascus Suburb,274 victims in Dar'aa,162 in Aleppo,57 refugees died in separated boarder areas, 88 victims in Homs,34 victims in Hama,32 victims in Lathekia, 30 victims in Al Qunitera, 19 victims from the Palestinian camps residents in Aleppo where most of them died in Idlib while they were serving in the compulsory service in the PLA where they were executed in a horrible massacre on 11/7/2012 and 3 victims in Al Sowayda.

Recent Updates

The distribution of a limited quantity of aids on the besieged residents of the Yarmouk camp was resumed yesterday, where people were gathered near Al Reeja square waiting for their turn to get the aids. It is referred that the Regular Army and the Groups of the PFGC impose a strict siege on the camp for 497 days respectively. The residents complain of the power cut for more than a year and a half and the water cut for 67 days respectively in addition to the unavailability of fuel which increased their suffering.



Water crisis in Yarmouk camp

In Damascus Suburb, the Jermana camp residents are suffering of the drinking water cut for three days amid requests from the residents for the Public Refugees Commission and the UNRWA to interfere to solve their problem. It is mentioned that the camp lives in a calm state compared to other camps, which are suffering of bad economic situation. The residents are complaining of the wide spread of unemployment and the high prices of food materials in addition to the high prices of the rent houses. The residents of Al Aedin camp in Hama live in a relative calmness where the suffering is concentrated on the economic side because of the high prices of food materials and living in general, in addition to the fuel crises and the high rate of unemployment.

Release

The Syrian Security released Nezar Mohammed Saleem Omar, A PA Officer, who was arrested by the Syrian security Detachment which is responsible for Al Aedin camp in Homs, on Wednesday 26th of October 2014, after raids on his house in the camp. It is mentioned that he is in his fiftieth, from AL Shajara village in Palestine; he was arrested two times after he returned back from Iraq in 2003 where he spent a year and a half in the Syrian prisons. The second time, he was arrested in the Yarmouk camp during a demonstration in front of Al Waseem mosque and stayed in the detention a year and three month then he was released because of the deterioration of his health in the beginning of 2014.

Turkey

On 14th of November 2014, The Turkish authorities released the Syrian refugees in Adana prison, while it is still detaining the Palestinians of Syria, waiting for the UNRWA to decide about them after the Palestine Embassy in Ankara neglected its responsibilities towards them.

It is mentioned that the Turkish Coast Guards arrested 51 Palestinian Syrian refugees while they were trying to reach Europe from the Turkish coasts where they were detained for one day in the Turkish Gendarmerie then to Adana Prison.

Egypt

On Friday, Amnesty International called Egypt to release about 70 refugees most of them are Palestinians who were fled from the conflict in Syria where they are arrested illegally and threatened to be deported to Syria. Amnesty international, which defends Human Rights, said that at least 66 refugees are arrested now including 56 Palestinians who came from Syria and the Egyptian navy found them on an island which is 4Km far from the northern of Alexandria. The organization clarified, in a statement, that the refugees were abandoned by their smugglers in October after they have promised them to transfer them to Europe. Amnesty International added that the Egyptian Attorney General ordered

to release them on the 5th of November 2014 but the State Security issued compulsory memos of deportation to Syria. It mentioned that there are at least 15 women and 10 children between 8 months and 16 years old amongst the detained refugees.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics

- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 498 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 581 days, water was cut for 68 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 157 victims.
- 41 Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria.
- 95 PLA members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 400 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 369 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 569 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 215 days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
- Khan Danoun Camp: Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- Al Nairab Camp: Power is still cut for more than a year.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Ca mps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
