"Shelling on Environs of Al-Neirab Camp in Aleppo Chokes Several Children"

Latest Developments

Barrages of shells were slammed into the environs of Al-Neirab Camp for Palestinian refugees in Aleppo, overnight Monday, causing several children to choke.

12-year-old Ahmad Hawash, among several other children, sustained critical breathing disorders as a result of the fumes emanating from the exploded shells.



The government-led Al-Neirab Camp has been a hotbed for deadly hostilities due to its strategic proximity to the Al-Neirab Military Airport.

In a related development, the Syrian regime militias struck the Yarmouk Camp, in southern Damascus, with mortar shells, causing remarkable material damage.

ISIS battalions also targeted the main entrance to Yarmouk Camp, where government squads and their abettors have been deployed, with a round of shells. No casualties were reported in the offensive.

Live snapshots circulated on Facebook showed a number of civilian homes in Haifa Street, in Yarmouk, as being destroyed by wildfires.

Meanwhile, the Syrian government warplanes hit Khan Al-Sheih's surrounding ranches, in western Damascus Suburbs, with over 15 barrel bombs.

The Syrian regime battalions have sealed off all thoroughfares to Khan Al-Sheih Camp for Palestinian refugees, blocking civilians' movement inside and out for 46 days running.

In another development, the Jafra Foundation for Relief and Development has continued to provide Khan Al-Sheih residents with relief assistance despite the deadly bombardments rocking the camp.

Jafra volunteers pumped drinking water for the refugees and removed the mounds of debris piled up by the unabated blitzes on the camp.

In the meantime, Palestinian-Syrian refugees stranded in Greece have sounded distress signals over the mistreatment and medical neglect to which they have been subjected.

In letters emailed to AGPS, the Palestinians of Syria launched cries for help over their frail legal status after the Greek authorities declined their appeals to grant them asylum.

The refugees spoke out against the crackdowns perpetrated by the Greek government against them. They said the government has been denying them the right to undergo medical treatment and check-ups in public hospitals, forcing the refugees to pay steep fees to private clinics. Others have been through sharp health setbacks as they failed to meet the costly charges in private clinics.

Those sheltered in Chios Island said they have been taking refuge in makeshift tents where insects and reptiles, along with a poor hygiene, have made the area uninhabitable.

Palestinians of Syria: November 15, 2016 Statistics:

- There are 15,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Jordan.
- 42,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are in Lebanon.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt, according to UNRWA figures covering the period from July 2015 backwards.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.

- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees reside in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
- Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,246 days in a row. Electricity and water supplies have been cut off, respectively, for 1,305 days and 766 days. The number of those killed due to the blockade has hit 190.
- Sbiena refugee camp: Refugees could not go back to their homes as a result of the blockade slapped by the Syrian regime forces since 1,099 days running.
- Handarat refugee camp: All refugees left the camp since 1,291 days after opposition outfits grabbed hold of the area.
- Deraa refugee camp: Water has been cut off for 949 consecutive days while 70% of its buildings have been knocked down.
- Homs camp, Hama camp, Jaramana camp, al-Sayda Zeinab camp, Al-Raml camp: A of State of relative calm has been reported in the abovementioned areas. However, economic crises have been on the rise.
- Khan al-Sheih refugee camp: All access roads out of and into the camp have been closed off by the Syrian regime army for 47 days running.
