

Latest Developments

At least 300 Palestinian refugees, including 38 women, have gone missing since the outburst of the Syrian warfare, AGPS found out.

According to AGPS data, over half of the missing Palestinians were residents of Yarmouk Camp, in southern Syria.

Activists held the pro-government forces in Syria responsible for the arbitrary mass abduction sweeps launched against Palestinian refugees. In several cases, a detainee is only released after his/her family is made to pay a steep ransom.



AGPS believes the number is far higher due to the gag orders slapped by the Syrian regime on the names and fates of the detainees, along with the families' reluctance to report the names of missing relatives for fear of retaliation. Several other refugees kidnapped by AlNusra Front and ISIS have also been enduring mysterious fates.

Meanwhile, the Palestinian woman Suad Saoud Saoud, a resident of Khan AlSheih Camp, was kidnapped four days earlier by the Syrian

government forces deployed in Jdeidat Artouz town, in Khan AlSheih, in Rif Dimashq.

The fate of 100 Palestinian women kidnapped by the Syrian regime forces has been shrouded in mystery since the outbreak of the Syrian conflict.

In another development, ISIS transferred its so-called Site 3 in AlHajar Aswad to AlJa'ouna neighborhood, in Yarmouk Camp.

The transferred site handles cases of those arrested on security grounds.

A few days earlier, AGPS unraveled the locations and missions of ISISrun security branches in AlHajar AlAswad stronghold.

In the meantime, residents of Tahrir AlSham-led zones west of Yarmouk Camp planted cucumber, among other vegetables, in an attempt to assuage to aftermaths of the siege enforced by the Syrian government forces and their abettors, on the one hand, and ISIS militias, on the other.

ISIS militias have tightened grip in AlRija Square, Haifa Street, and Safouriya Street, west of Yarmouk Camp, on claims that they are led by Tahrir AlSham rival group. Civilians' food has been seized by ISIS as part of the crackdowns carried out against families who returned to their homes in areas controlled by Tahrir AlSham.

Civil Action

The Palestine Charity Commission, in partnership with the Turkish IHH organization and AlSarraa Foundation for Humanitarian Relief,

distributed 100 food baskets to a number of families displaced from Yarmouk Basin and AlMzeirib.

AlMzeirib is home to 1,700 Palestinian families, along with hundreds of Palestinian families displaced from Daraa Camp. Residents of the area have been enduring dire conditions due to the unabated onslaughts and the absence of relief aids by UNRWA, among other relief bodies.



Palestinians of Syria: July 16, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,526 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,615 Palestinian refugees, including 101 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,453 days in a row.
- 196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.

- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,189 and 1,038 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,533 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 267 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria fled to Europe until the end of 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
