Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"For the Third Consecutive Day, Residents of South Damascus Demonstrate in Rejection to Forced Displacement"

- Palestinian family confirms death of their son due to torture in Syrian regime prisons
- Reports that patients and injured will be released from "Tahrir Al-Sham" areas in Yamrouk camp within the next few days
- "Charitable Association" in Damascus begins distributing orphans' sponsorships



Victims

Palestinian man "Amer Muhammed Kheir Al-Nabolsy" has died due to torture in the Syrian regime's prisons. His family condoled their son's passing and said he died on 4-12-2014, raising the number of victims due to torture in AGPS's records to 473.

AGPS receives a number of messages and statistics regarding Palestinian prisoners and records them accordingly, despite the difficulties of the process because of the Syrian regime that continues to hide the fates, names and locations of the detainees.



Latest Developments

For the third consecutive day, residents of south Damascus continue their demonstrations and night sit-ins in the towns of Yelda, Babilla and Beit Sahm, to express their rejection of including the area in Kafria and Al-Foua's agreement, as well as forcibly displacing the residents and changing its demographics.

The protests and sit-ins in south Damascus came after several international media sources announced an agreement between the



regional countries, demanding that liberated south Damascus be handed over to the Syrian government and displacing the disobedient to the north, in exchange for evacuating the residents of Kafria and Al-Foua from the suburb of Idlib.



Thousands of Palestinian refugees are now living in the three towns, after being displaced from Yarmouk camp due to bombardments by the Syrian government forces and ISIS taking control of it.

In a similar context, AGPS's correspondent in south Damascus said that a number of patients and injured people are expected to be released from "Tahrir A-Sham" areas, west of Yarmouk camo, in the upcoming days. This comes under the four-city agreement signed "Tahrir Al-Sham" and the Syrian regime, which includes Yarmouk camp.

ISIS continues its tightening procedures on the residents of "Rijh" Square and the streets of "Haifa" and "Seforeyya," west of Yarmouk camp under the pretext of subordination to the control of Tahrir Al-Sham (previously known as Fath Al-Sham), by continuing to impose a siege on that area.



Almost 130 members of "Tahrir Al-Sham" (previously known as Al-Nusra) are located in the areas it controls in Yarmouk camp, according to Syrian government sources. They are expected to be evacuated from the camp to north Syria, under the four-city agreement with the regime.

Local Work Committees:

Within the framework of the social welfare and orphan care program, the "Charitable Association for Palestinian Relief "in Damascus has started distributing financial donations to the orphans registered with them, and provided them with school bags and stationery.

The majority of Palestinian- Syrian families live on the aid provided to them by organizations and relief agencies.



Palestinians of Syria: September 16, 2017 Statistics:

 The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3579, including 462 women

- 1637 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 103 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,522 days in a row
- 199 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1259 days, and 1099 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,595 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 346 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
