"Egyptian Authorities Continue Detaining Palestinian Syrian Refugees in its Prisons"




Detainees held by the Egyptian authorities

Recent Updates

The Egyptian authorities continue to detain 56 Palestinian refugees from Syria, after being arrested while trying to reach Italy, launching from the Turkish coasts on 25th of October 2014.

The refugees have been victims of a scam by smugglers who left them alone in front of an island at the Egyptian shores, where the Egyptian authorities arrested them. The authorities have released all Syrian detainees, while kept detaining 56 Palestinians, since all surrounding countries refused to receive them.

The refugees were asked to choose either to be deported to Syria or to stay in prison, while they renewed their call to all human rights and international organizations to urgently and immediately intervene to release them and alleviate their suffering.

On the other hand, violent clashes broke out in the Yarmouk refugee camp between groups of the Syrian opposition and the regular army alongside with the PFGC at the vicinity of the Yarmouk municipality Palestine Street, and Al Reija square which was targeted with a number of shells.

In the same context, "Al Tieba" town, adjacent to Khan Dannon camp in Damascus suburb, was also targeted with a number of shells, which was clearly heard inside the camp.

In terms of living aspect, the Palestinian refugees in Daraa camp are still suffering of the water cuts for 216 days respectively in light of medical and relief services absence. Two-thirds of the camp's buildings were demolished due to the repeated bombing, forcing hundreds of families to leave their houses and flee to the adjacent camps and towns.

Meanwhile, the Palestinian refugees in Al Aedein camp in Hama are suffering of economic problems such as high prices of food supplies and house rents in addition to the scarcity of fuel and its very high prices, if it was available, while the unemployment is increasing complicating the economic situation. Al Aedein camp in Hama is considered one of the calmest camps in Syria.



The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics

- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 499 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 582 days, water was cut for 69 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 157 victims.
- 41 Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria.
- 95 PLA members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 401 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 370 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 570 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 216 days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
- Khan Danoun Camp: Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- Al Nairab Camp: Power is still cut for more than a year.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Ca mps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
