### *"The Regular Army Allows Husseneia Residents to Return Gradually to the Camp after 655 Days"*



- Six Palestinians Died in Syria, Including Five Members of One Family
- Bombing at the Yarmouk Camp and a Charred Body was Found at his Home
- Power and water Return to Neirab after Seven Days Cut
- Syrian Security Released a Detainee with Special Needs
- Food Baskets Distribution to the Displaced People of Yarmouk in Neighboring Towns
- The Deteriorating Security Situation Exacerbates the Suffering of Al Wafedein Residents

### **Victims**

*Five Palestinian refugees from one family, including two children died due to bombing that targeted Ein Alfija area in Damascus suburb on Friday.*

*The victims are: Ahmed Mahmoud al-Khatib, his wife Nahed Omar Dakhil Allah, and their two children, Aya and Munji Ahmed al-Khatib; they died immediately after the bombing, while Ms. Amna al-Khatib "died due to wounds she attained yesterday morning.*

*Meanwhile, the young man "Iyad Alsrouje," a resident of Muzeireeb town, died during clashes that broke out yesterday in Daraa town southern Syria, as he was fighting alongside the Syrian opposition groups.*



### **Recent Updates**

*Some Palestinian families returned back to Al Husaineyya camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus suburb, after being banned by the Regular Army and displaced for 655 days.*

*According to multiple sources, the regular army checkpoints allowed families to enter the camp gradually during coming days.*

*It is worth mentioning that Husseiniya camp had witnessed violent clashes more than (655) days ago between the regular army and groups*



*affiliated to the armed opposition, ended with regular army full control of the camp, however, the army prevented residents who were forced to leave their homes to return to it throughout the that period.*



***Families returning back to Al Husaineyya camp***

*Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees south of Syria was exposed to night bombing and a number of shells that targeted separate areas of the camp and led to only material damages coincided with clashes between ISIS alongside Al Nusra front against Regular Army alongside the Palestinian factions.*

*The clashes centered on the beginning of Yarmouk and Palestine Street near the Yarmouk high school for girls. The residents of Yarmouk found a charred dead body of unknown person and according to activists that the dead person was killed then burnt during the previous days, where they couldn't recognize his identity.*

*In a different context, Themar Charity organization continues its relief work and food aid to Yarmouk camp besieged and displaced residents at Yelda, Bebla, Bait Sahm adjacent areas to the camp. The organization distributes drinking water to the besieged Yarmouk residents due to the water cut on all lanes and houses of the camp for 334 days respectively.*

*In Aleppo, the AGPS correspondent reported the return of Power and water to Al Nairab camp after being cut for a week, the reporter mentioned that power and water cut was due to the decreasing of gas pressure at the power plant that led to stop the plant, in addition to the difficulty to reach the maintenance workers to this plant due to the deteriorated security situation in the plant area.*

*The Syrian Security released yesterday Adham Al Naji, 17 years old, from Al Nairab camp after being arrested for several days while returning back from work in Aleppo city.*

*In Damascus Suburb, the deteriorated security situation in the adjacent towns to Al Wafdeen camp, which is 20km far from Damascus City, and bombing of the camp, negatively impacted the situation of the residents, who already suffer of poverty, high rates of unemployment, and dire living crises even before the events in Syria.*

### ***Numbers and Statistics till 16/8/2015***

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 775 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 844 days, water was cut for 334 days*



*respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 180 victims.*

- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 637 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 838 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 482 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL SaiedaZainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
