Latest Developments

Displaced families in the Muhammadiya and Deir Ballout refugee camps in northern Syria have raised concerns about the upshots of the flooding of the Afrin river in the wake of heavy rains.

High water levels last week cut off the road between the two camps and nearby zones. Refugee tents are also at a risk of being flooded by water. Children's toys were washed away by the rain.

Sometime earlier, UNICEF warned that harsh winter conditions have had tragic fallouts on refugee children.



For many displaced Palestinian refugees, the perils of winter weather add to the torment already experienced through conflict.

Nearly 600 displaced families, among them 325 Palestinian families, have been struggling for survival in the poorly-equipped Deir Ballout Camp, after they were forced out of Yarmouk and southern Damascus towns.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Jamal Ahmad Na'im, born in 1987, has been enduring a mysterious fate in Syrian government prisons, where he has been locked up for over three years.



His fate and condition remain unknown. He was kidnapped at the Ibn Nafis checkpoint, in Damascus, on September 24, 2015.

Three years ago, reports said he was last spotted in the state-run Sednaya military prison.



AGPS documented the detention of 1,724 Palestinians in Syrian government prisons, including more than 105 women and girls.

In another development, Palestinian refugee Mujeeb AlRahman Naser Shanati, taking shelter in AlAyedeen Camp in Hums, has won the first rank in human medicine in Damascus.





Mujeeb was honored by the Minister of Higher Education and the deans of Damascus universities.

Dozens of success stories have been achieved by Palestinian students from Syria nationwide and overseas.

In the meantime, AlWafaa European Campaign arrived on Wednesday in Turkey, coming from Lebanon, in an attempt to launch the "For a Warm Winter Campaign – 8) aiming to tone down the calamitous conditions endured by the displaced Palestinian refugees south of Turkey and north of Syria.

The delegation said it has been discussing with the concerned authorities in Kilis city, south of Turkey, mechanisms to hand over aids to the Palestinian communities.

AlWafaa delegates are expected to pay a visit to Palestinian refugee communities in Kilis, Gaziantep, Reyhanli, Antakya, and Urfa cities pending a final approval by the Turkish authorities to enter Deir Ballout Camp and adjacent communities.

The AlWafaa Campaign has just wrapped up a five-day relief mission in Lebanon-based refugee camps. Cash aids, foodstuff, children's milk, heating kit, winter clothes and mattresses were distributed to the displaced refugees.
