#### **RECENT UPDATES**

A Palestinian girl "Maram Alsayed" was shot dead by Turkish borders guards last night. Maram and her family were attempting to cross the Syrian-Turkish border fleeing the torn-war country when she was fired. Activists reported that three unknown victims were shot also by Turkish guards whilst trying to cross the border at Al-Qamishli-Al-Qahtaniyah point north east Syria.



On the other hand, the Palestinian refugee, Kamal Abbas, announced dead in the Syrian prisons. Abbas, from Yarmouk camp, had been tortured to death after years in jail. The 56-year-old man rises the torturing victims to 433, whereas, 1057 are still in enforced disappearance, according to AGPS. Worth to mention that Abbas is descendent of Hittin village north Palestine.

In Damascus Suburbs, the Syrian artillery fired the farms around Khan-Esheih camp. The shelling from, Al-Kabousyeh hill, targeted the area causing panic among the locals. It is worth mentioning that all bombing by artillery, mortars and tanks launch from Al-Kabousyeh military hill forming a sleepless obsession for the residents in the camp.

In the same context, news talking about re-opening the only access to Khan Esheih camp via Zakiya. The news comes in the wake of the control imposed by the Syrian forces based in 173 Regiment. But the road, called "the death road", is still under the threat of snipers and targeting by the Syrian forces, where many victims were killed on this road. AGPS documented 147 victims from Kkan Esheih camp during the last five years.

Moving to the mid-country in Homs, Syrian security has released two Palestinian refugees. Ghaleb Qasem "Abu Ibraheem", was released after 4 years in jail. Whereas, Musaab Mawed, released after 10 months in jail. They are from Homos camp where 186 out of 1057 Palestinian refugees are still in enforced disappearance.

In a different context, AGPS monitoring team documented 51 Palestinian victims from Al-Neirb camp in Aleppo over the course of the past five years. The victims were divided according to the death reasons, where 17 victims by shooting, 13 by explosions, 10 by bombing, 5 by snipers and 3 unknown reasons.

It is noteworthy that the Palestinian victims from the beginning of the conflict reached 3132, according to AGPS list.

### Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 17 February 2016

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command), continued for 977 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1035 days, water cut for 527 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 186 victims.
- Al Sheina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 833 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1026 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 687 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.
- Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.
