Latest Developments

AGPS calls on the Syrian regime to disclose the fate of hundreds of Palestinian detainees who have gone missing so far.

AGPS believes that the arbitrary internment of Palestinian refugees in war-torn Syria amounts to a war crime.

Many reports issued by AGPS, such as "Enforced Disappearance 1," "Enforced Disappearance 2," and the "Pictures Massacre," provide details about the Palestinian victims of torture and enforced disappearance during the bloody conflict.



461 Palestinian refugees, including 34 women died under torture in Syrian government lock-ups. 59 causalities were identified through live snapshots leaked from Syrian penal complexes. Dozens of Syrian nationals have endured a similar fate.

AGPS kept record of several cases where Palestinians have been kidnapped at government checkpoints or during assaults carried out by the regime troops on Palestinian shelters. In most such cases, the detainees' families receive their relatives' bodies from a military or government hospital while wrapped up in a plastic bag or in a bloodtainted piece of cloth.

AGPS renews its calls to the Palestinians of Syria to register the names of their detained or missing relatives on the group's official website. Lists of missing or detained refugees are available on AGPS website, both in English and Arabic. AGPS supplies a database of their names and possible times and places of arrest.

AGPS documented the incarceration of 1,185 Palestinian detainees in Syrian jails. 300 Palestinians have, meanwhile, gone missing.

Civil Action Commissions

The Charity Commission for Relief of the Palestinian People, in partnership with the Palestinian Red Crescent, wrapped up the First Medical Week campaign in Khan AlSheih Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Rif Dimashq.

Nearly 1,275 Palestinian refugees underwent medical check-ups at five clinics opened by the charity all the way through the campaign. Thousands of medicines were also distributed to sick refugees.

The move comes at a time when the Syrian government forces tightened grip on the camp, blocking the entry of medicines, gas, fuel, and chargers. The residents have also been denied access to their homes.

Some 2,500 Palestinian refugees were forcibly deported from Khan AlSheih Camp to the northern Syrian province of Idlib as of Monday, November 28, 2016, following an agreement between the government forces and the opposition outfits.



At the same time, the Palestine Charity Commission in southern Syria, in cooperation with Khaira Oumma organization, distributed orphan allowances to 10 families sheltered in AlMuzeireeb at an estimated sum of \$45 per every orphan.

The charity, in partnership with the Turkish IHH organization, also handed over 100 food baskets to 100 needy families displaced from Yarmouk Basin, among other areas, and who have been seeking refuge in AlMuzeireeb and Zizon.

AlMuzeireeb is home to nearly 1,700 Palestinian families along with hundreds of other Palestinian families displaced from Daraa Camp. Living conditions have taken a turn for the worse in the area due to the rampant warfare and the lack of relief assistance.

Palestinians of Syria: April 17, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,478 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,183 Palestinian refugees, including 86 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,369 days in a row.
- 195 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,100 and 950 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,444 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 178 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.

- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
