Latest Developments

Residents of Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees urged Syrian Foreign Minister Faysal Miqdad to take serious action in response to the Israeli aggressions on Gaza.

The refugees called on the Foreign Minister to also work on rehabilitating their houses and property in the ravaged Yarmouk Camp, south of Damascus, pending their return to their homeland.

On the 73rd anniversary of the Israeli-inflicted Nakba of 1948, in reference to the expulsion of thousands of Palestinians from their homes by Zionist militias, scores of Palestinian refugees sheltered in displacement camps across Syria, have expressed deep anger over Israel's escalating violence and state terrorism in the occupied Palestinian territories and deadly aggressions on besieged Gaza.

In another development, Syrian security forces have ordered shopkeepers in Jaramana Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Rif Dimashq, to post banners supporting the Syrian President Bashar AlAssad in the upcoming elections.

A number of shopkeepers posted the banners for fear of being fined by the Syrian security forces.

Meanwhile, a number of Palestinian refugees rallied on Monday, May 17, outside of the UN office in AlMezzeh, in Damascus, protesting the escalating Israeli violence on the besieged Gaza Strip.



The demonstrators urged the UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres to take serious action in response to Israel's horrendous crimes against the Palestinians and flagrant breaches of international law and relevant UN resolutions.

In another development, residents of AlHusainiya Camp, in Rif Dimashq, said they have been increasingly terrorized and blackmailed by bandits strolling around residential neighborhoods.

The residents said gangsters have been wavering white weapons, harassing girls, consuming drugs, and blackmailing the residents.
