"The Palestinians of Syria Stuck in Greece are suffering from lack of medication and the Doctors Discrimination"

Recent Updates

Hundreds of Palestinian-Syrian refugees who stuck in Greece are complaining of medical negligence and failure to provide the medication, and treatment for them, as they are suffering from poor living- conditions after closing all roads between them and the European countries in the face of the refugees who risked their lives to get to Greece from Turkish beaches.



The Palestinian-Syrian journalist (Amal Faour) who is stuck in Greece confirmed to AGPS that Palestinian-Syrian refugees are suffering from lack of medication, and doctors' discrimination who are dealing with them is inhumane way, noting that these doctors have refused to receive and treat some Palestinian families because of their nationality Amal said, adding that Lack of medication is threatening the lives of many refugees.

In turn, these families appealed all the international and humanitarian organizations, the International Red Cross and the Palestinian embassy in Greece to provide emergency medical assistance to the hundreds of

patients who were left without and medical assistance, also they called the Liberation Organization and the Palestinian factions to work to end the plight of the Palestinian-Syrian refugees, which continues denying their right to treatment which guaranteed by international and humanitarian laws.

On the other hand, a number of activists accused the Liberation Organization and the Palestinian embassy in Greece of neglecting the refugees and not to monitor the situation of Palestinian-Syrian who are stuck in Greece, as activists called the residents not to appeal the Palestinian Authority because they are not interested in their affairs, one of the activists confirmed that, he has sent many messages to the Palestinian Authority and the Palestinian embassy in Greece, which highlights the suffering of the Palestinian refugees in Greece, but the ambassador did not respond to any of them, and did not visit the refugees in the camps according to him.

It is noteworthy that the Palestinian-Syrian refugees who were forced to stay in temporary refugee camps in Greece after the closure of the borders that lead to Europe are suffering from the lack of the basic services in their locations, as most of the houses are temporary shelters or tents, within the huge spread of insects, reptiles and poisonous snakes.

In Damascus, Qudsayya village – where about 6000 of the Palestinian-Syrian families were diplaced- witnessed violent clashes in which they used medium and heavy weapons, where the clashes took place at the town's barrier between the regular army and groups of armed Syrian opposition, and according to activists in the town, clashes for which

lasted several hours stopped within truce talk between the regular army forces and opposition groups.



It is mentioned that the town is under the control of the armed opposition is under the siege, where people are suffering from great difficulties in securing basic living materials.

On another context, activists of Alfajr Relief Institution re-built many small refuges in Khan-Sheih Camp for the Palestinian refugees in Damascus, seeking for securing some safe points for the residents of the camp especially after the air raids that targeted the camp during the last few weeks. It is known that, the camp had been under attack of the Russian and Syrian air raids causing dozens of deaths and wounds.



In the context, Aleslah Society distributed food to a number of Palestinian-Syrian families who displaced to Sidon City, in the south of

Lebanon, and according to those in charge of the Society, 125 families were benefited from the food that provided by the Turkish Association - Tareq Alhaya-, noting that the Palestinians-Syrian committee in Lebanon is about to distribute these aids.

According to UNRWA statistics, 42 thousand of the Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Lebanon are suffering from frequent crisis, the most prominent crisis is the legal and economic crisis, the high cost of living in general, and rents homes in particular in addition to the lack of jobs in Lebanon, and for several reasons, including the legal situation and widespread unemployment.

Meanwhile, Palestinian -Syrian refugees who have fled to # Egypt because of the war in Syria confirmed that, Egyptian authorities refused to give them residency in Egypt, despite being in Egypt for the needed period of time, where the responsible authorities refuse to issue residencies for them in spite of the achievement of all residency requirements in Egypt.

That comes within the economic difficulties that the Palestinians-Syrian refugees are facing in Egypt, where many of them are suffering from great difficulties in securing suitable jobs, due to the bad economic situation in Egypt on one hand, and the inability to work legally due to not having the residency.

Palestinians-Syrian in Egypt are complaining of the lack of the official representation of them, as many of the refugees have confirmed to AGPS that the Palestinian embassy, the Palestinian Liberation Organization,

It is mentioned that, about 6000 of the Palestinian –Syrian refugees have moved to Egypt due to the War in Syria.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 17\08\2016

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till mid 2016
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1157consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1217 days, water was cut for 706 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 1009 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1200 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 860 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
