Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"Bombardment targets Yarmouk camp and the Syrian regime negotiates ISIS in the south of Damascus to exchange prisoners"

- Palestinian-Syrian opens his first photography exhibition in Germany



## **Latest Developments**

The Syrian regime forces and its affiliated factions, bombarded the Martyrs sector and the outskirts of Palestine Street in Yarmouk camp, using mortar shells on Sunday, causing destruction to the civilian houses.

On his part, the Action Group's correspondent reported based on sources from Yarmouk camp, that the Syrian regime entered into negotiations with ISIS in south Damascus, to carry out an exchange. According to the sources, the regime forces requested that two bodies of ISIS's fighters be handed over to them, in exchange for regime releasing female detainees from its prisons.

ISIS had arrested two fighters from the pro-regime factions during its attack on the positions of the "National Defense" militia in the Tadamon neighborhood last Wednesday. ISIS then cut off their heads and toured with them around the areas of its control, in the south of Damascus.

In south Syria, the regime forces stationed in the city of Deraa, targeted several mortar shells at the Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees, destroying the residents' houses.



The remaining residents of Al-Sad Road are complaining from the harsh humanitarian conditions, due to the siege imposed by the regime's army on the camp and its adjacent areas. They are also suffering from an extreme lack of food supplies, as well as the continuous water, electricity and communication cuts for long periods of time.



In the suburbs of Damascus, the Syrian regime released the Palestinian man, "Shady El-Hindi," after being detained for almost a year. This was the second time he was arrested and released. Shady is a resident of Khan Al-Sheih camp for Palestinian refugees, in the suburbs of Damascus.



The Syrian regime forces had detained a number of Khan Al-Sheih's residents, after the opposition groups left, in coordination with the regime. At that time, it raided the headquarters of the relief institutions in it.

AGPS's documented statistics reveal that 242 refugees from Khan Al-Sheih camp are still under the Syrian regime's detention.

In another context, the Palestinian-Syrian photographer, "Adnan Abd Al-Rahman" opened his first exhibition of nature photography in the German city of Veringenstadt, in the attendance of the city's Mayor, Armin Christ, and a number of artists and German visitors.

A number of German volunteers and activists participated in the "In the Eyes of Syria" Exhibition, with the support of Veringenstadt's municipality. The exhibition included a number of nature pictures, taken in the Alpine regions of southwest Germany.





As for the selection of pictures of the exhibition, Adnan says that the selection of these shots was because of the beauty of nature in southern Germany, especially in the Black Forest area.

Adnan from the Yarmouk refugee camp, located in the south of the Syrian capital Damascus, who entered Germany at the beginning of 2012, studied Information Technology in Syria and completed his studies of the German language. He currently works in a software company, and practices photography as his hobby in Germany.
