"Iranian forces "mistakenly" bombed Neirab camp a few days ago"

- Sabina camp: Residents renew their appeal to end stray dogs phenomenon
- Continues "Stealing" in Yarmouk camp to remove the marble
- Syrian regime has been holding Omar Allao for 7 years



Latest developments

Iranian forces stationed in Brigade 80 near Aleppo airport "accidently" bombed on May 14 Neirab camp for Palestinian refugees killing and injuring Palestinian civilians, media sources close to the Syrian regime and its affiliated group Liwa al-Quds reported.

Sources added that ongoing investigation revealed that members of the Iranian forces in the military brigade made a mistake in missile guidance system, causing the missile to miss its trajectory and land in the camp.



A delegation from the "Friends of Iran Forces" will head to Neirab camp this week to examine the damage caused by the bombing, the sources continued, noting that the regime-affiliated Liwa al-Quds group confirmed that perpetrators will be punished as to ensure this incident never happens again.

Neirab camp was hit by four guided missiles claiming the lives of nine Palestinians. The state-run media sources laid the blame on Syrian opposition forces. It is noted that the location of Neirab



camp, adjacent to Neirab military airport, made it a strategic site for both sides of the conflict in Syria. The camp came previously under fire and bombardment resulting in civilian casualties. Many of the camp's residents died because of their involvement in the civil war.

In southern Damascus, activist said, citing eyewitnesses, that Syrian regime-affiliated groups are stealing marble from houses in Rama, Yarmouk and the 15 streets in the devastated Yarmouk camp, in a phenomenon linked to Syrian regime troops called 'Tafish'. The activists noted that these groups are affiliated to the Fourth Division, the security services and a number of Palestinian factions, adding that they collect the stolen materials and transfer them outside the camp.



Syrian army members along with affiliated Palestinian groups stole civilian homes in Yarmouk camp and the surrounding neighborhoods that the regime had sized control over them on 21 May, 2018.

On 19 April 2018, Yarmouk camp was attacked to expel ISIS from the camp, with Russian air support and the participation of



Palestinian factions, where all types of ground and air weapons were used, leaving 60% of Yarmouk camp damaged and dozens of civilians dead.

In Damascus countryside, residents of the Sabina refugee camp complained of the stray dogs which are roaming the camp's neighborhoods in large numbers and attacking civilians. The camp's residents accused the concerned sides of carelessness and neglect of this phenomenon, which has become a source of fear for them and led to the outbreak of diseases. The residents had called on the countryside councils and Quneitra municipality to find a solution for this phenomenon.

Residents of the Sabina refugee camp suffer harsh humanitarian conditions due to widespread unemployment and a lack of financial resources and basic services as well as water and power shortages for long terms, in addition to a lack of gas and fuel.

Meanwhile, Syrian security forces has been holding Palestinian refugee Omar Ahmed Alloa, from Yarmouk camp for the seven consecutive year with information of his whereabouts and fate remaining unknown.





Alloa was arrested at AlJaleel school in Yarmouk camp on 28/09/2012.

AGPS documented the arrest of 1,756 Palestinians, including 107 women, in the Syrian prisons.
