Latest Developments

Palestinians taking refuge in Daraa Camp, south of Syria, have lashed out at the local authorities for dragging their feet over the residents' appeals for rehabilitating infrastructure and sanitation networks.

The residents said the poor sanitation networks and improper sewage disposal, which they attributed to the frequent blackouts and maintenance works in the area, have brought about an acute damage on their health and property.



The displaced families warned of the life-threatening diseases wrought by poisonous rodents and unpleasant smells stemming from contaminated sewage, saying waste water continues to flow into their refugee camp around the clock.

The families continue to urge the local authorities and relief institutions, namely UNRWA, to make urgent steps in order to rinse out waste water and enhance hygiene in the area.

In another development, Palestinian woman Mona Aneissi, born in 1960, disappeared from Nahr Eisheh area, in Damascus,



some three days ago. She is reportedly a resident of Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees.

According to AGPS data, 323 Palestinian refugees have gone missing since the outburst of deadly warfare in Syria.



Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Atiyeh Hasan Othman, born in 1955, was released from a Syrian government prison, where he had been held for four months.

Atiyeh, from Daraa Camp, south of Syria, was arrested in Ein Karsh, in Damascus, as he applied for a travel permit to legally gain access to Lebanon.

Over 1,756 Palestinian refugees have been enduring mysterious fates in Syrian state jails, among the 107 women and dozens of minors.

In the meantime, Palestinian girl Bisan Esam Khuza'i received an exemption certificate from AlAbrar Educational Center in Lebanon's western AlBekaa region, granting her the privilege to pass without sitting for the last-semester exams for the academic year 2018-2019.



Bisan, a 1st year high school enrollee, obtained the exams exemption certification thanks to the outstanding results she has achieved all the way through the school year.

Born and raised in AlSayeda Zeinab Camp, in Syria, Bisan and her family fled to Lebanon in 2012, one year after the deadly warfare took away the life of her father. Her dream job is to become a surgeon and tend to the wounded in the Israeli-blockaded Gaza Strip and other war-stricken zones.

In 2017, Bisan received a similar exemption honor after she garnered the highest marks at her school.
