Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"The parents of a boy from Yarmouk camp call for saving their son's life and securing the necessary treatment for him"

- The Charitable Association continues its campaign to clean the streets of Sabinah camp, in the suburbs of Damascus
- Children of Neirab camp support Jerusalem
- A sit-in and lighten candles in Beddawi camp in solidarity with Yarmouk and in support of Jerusalem's victory



Latest Developments:

The parents of 10 year old "Youssef Adnan Zaatout" have called on all international and Palestinian organizations and relief institutions inside and outside of Syria, to help provide treatment for their son, who suffers from complications of lupus erythematosus.

According to the people, the cost of his treatment is extremely expensive and they cannot afford it. If his treatment is not completed, it may affect Youssef's life.



The parents called on UNRWA and the PLO to shoulder their responsibilities towards their son, who was taken out of the camp about a month ago, after his health deteriorated.

In another context, Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees was subjected to violent bombardments in the late hours of the day before yesterday. According to our correspondent, the Tadamon neighborhood and the outskirts of Yarmouk camp were targeted with rocket missiles, with the sound of the explosion spreading across the camp.



On his part, the Action Group's correspondent noted that a state of alert prevailed between members of ISIS in the camp, amid sharp divisions among the so-called leaders of ISIS, after many fled outside Yarmouk and AL-Hajar Al-Aswad, in coordination with members of the regime, who control the checkpoints surrounding the southern region.

The Charitable Association for Palestinian relief is continuing its campaign to organize the streets of the Sabinah refugee camp, in the suburbs of Damascus. The campaign, which is supervised by the Association, has reached the surrounding areas of UNRWA's schools in the camp, and it neighboring streets.



In north Syria, dozens of nursery children from Neirab camp, went out in a protest in support of Jerusalem and in rejection of Trump's decision to transfer the American embassy to Jerusalem, considering it the capital of the Israeli occupation, and to assert that Jerusalem is the capital of Palestine forever.

During the sit-in, the Palestinian flag was raised, as well as banners which read; "Jerusalem is ours - I love Jerusalem - Jerusalem is Arab and will remain Arab." The children wrapped their heads with the Palestinian scarf and band, and pictures of Al-Aqsa Mosque.



In Lebanon, the residents of Beddawi camp in the city of Tripoli, and dozens of Palestinian-Syrian families living in the camp, organized a sit-in on Tuesday, in front of the Democratic Front for the Liberation of Palestine's office, to mark the fifth anniversary of Yarmouk camp's tragedy, the victory of Jerusalem, and in rejection of Trump's decision to recognize Jerusalem as the capital of the Israeli occupation and the transfer of the American Embassy to the occupied Jerusalem.

The sit-in called for by the Union of the Right to Return Committee and the Committee of the displaced from Syria, included lit candles for the people of Yarmouk camp, those stationed in the city of Jerusalem and its people.



Palestinians of Syria: December 20, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3625, including 463 women
- 1644 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women

- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,617 days in a row
- 204 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1354 days, and 1194 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,690 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 453 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
