RECENT UPDATES

Activists close to the Palestinian Embassy in Lebanon are working on forming what they described as "Security Force" to work inside Al-Yarmouk Camp, special sources assured to the AGPS.

According to the same sources; a member of "Displaced follow-up Committee" which affiliates to Fateh Movement and works from inside the Palestinian Embassy in Beirut, has called for admission to recruit Palestinian-Syrian youngsters to be conscripted later in an armed group to work inside Al-Yarmouk Camp, while no enough information available regarding the nature of this "force" and its mission in the besieged camp by the Assad Regime and its militias.



This talk about the "Security Force" comes in light of frequent information about secret agreement between ISIS and the Syrian Regime to evacuate the camp from ISIS' members whereas other information confirmed forming pro-regime groups ready to take over the points controlled by ISIS later on.

In a different topic, Khan Eshieh camp is suffering from a severe health care crisis as all the hospitals had been shut down, in addition to reducing the UNRWA's sole clinic services to the minimum extent.

On his turn; AGPS' correspondent confirmed that the UNRWA's clinic work is inefficient, where it offers the minimum level of advisory work which does not meet the needs of thousands of inhabitants inside the semi-besieged camp.

The health care crisis is one of many crises suffered by the camp's people, the most notable ones are the shortage of relief services and the roads' shut down back and forth between the camp and the capital Damascus.

In a different topic, the Syrian Security continues arresting the Palestinian nurse "Basel Hasan Omar" 38-years-old since the date of 7 March 2013 until now. Basel used to work in Al-Mojtahid Governmental Hospital in Damascus, and had been arrested by security agents raided the hospital, while no information



at all regarding his fate or place of detention so far.

It should be noted that the Syrian Security is still arresting medical cadres who are unaccounted for, whereas many of them were tortured to death due to providing medical care to injuries during protests and demonstrations.

The AGPS managed to document 1043 Palestinian detainees in Assad's prisons who are unaccounted for, 431 were tortured to death.

Moving to Greece, where many families of Al-Aydeen Camp in Homs City have arrived Greece after long and hard waiting and harassment by Coastguards, while many others are still waiting in Turkey to get their chance to arrive Europe.

The reasons behind the growing phenomenon of migration goes back to the prosecutions of security and pro-regime militias which force the youth to join the obligatory military service in PLA, in addition to the frequent arrests, where the camp turned into a "large prison" as the security controls all the entrances and exits and had encircled the camp by huge iron mure with monitoring cameras all over.



Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 21 January 2016

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of

Palestine – General Command), continued for 922 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1011 days, water cut for 500 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 185 victims.

- Al Sheina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 806 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 999 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 660 days, and 70% of its buildings were distroyed.
- Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.
