The Action Group for Palestinians of Syria has issued, today's morning, a new expanded report sheds light on the conditions of Palestinian refugees living in Daraa province south of Syria.

The report titled "Palestinian Refugees in Daraa.. bitter reality and hard choices" monitors the major events occurred to PRS, either inside or outside the camps, during the period from March 2011 until March 2016, in three main chapters tackled introducing the camps and towns of the province in terms of the locations, borders, populations census and attempts to manage the crises and its reflections on civilians, in addition to the



statistics conducted by the AGPS teams regarding victims and arrestees.

RECENT UPDATES

The AGPS' correspondent reported a huge explosion hit the Al-Muzireeb town the day before yesterday, causing a terrific state of panic and horror to civilians, and severe damages to houses and properties.

In details, an unknown individuals implanted explosive device, Saturday's evening, in front of a shop at the main street of the town, exploded later and destroyed parts of the shop and a nearby house, with no reports of injuries.


A state of tension prevails the town inhabited by 8.500 Palestinians, since this kind of incidents is repeated continuously without any clue about the identity of the doer.



To Homs City, where the Syrian Security forces have released the chief of the Palestinian Sports Union, Couch "Mohammad Shihada Al-Shaabi" after being detained for four hours, during which he was interrogated in the Political Security Branch of Homs Camp.

Al-Shaabi is a one of the players of football team "Al-Wathba" in Homs, and still working as Sports Teacher in UNRWA's schools at the same time, known in his eagerness to hold sport activities in the camp despite the security conditions, noting that his is in his sixties, and originally descends from Ain-Azzayton village of Safad City in Palestine.


Moving to Lebanon, where Al-Wafaa European Campaign started its tour in Al-Bekaa Al-Awsat region, looking for needy Palestinian families living there to provide assistance for them.

The campaign's assistance included food parcels and cash money, and it is scheduled to last for seven days.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 21 March 2016

- 15,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan,
- 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command), continued for 1010 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1071 days, water cut

for 559 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 186 victims.

- Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 866 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1057 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 720 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.
- Jarmana, AL-Saieda Zainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and Al-AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al-Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.
