"ISIS Tightens Grip on Palestinians in Jilin Camp, Orders Evacuation"

Latest Developments

ISIS have tightened grip on the residents of Jilin Camp, in Daraa's western outskirts. ISIS militias also ordered civilians to evacuate their homes.

A massacre was perpetrated in ISIS by the end of February 2017 after ISIS-affiliated Khaled Ibn AlWalid battalion held sway over the town, following clashes with the regime army and their war partners.

An attack launched by ISIS by the end of March left four refugees wounded as they attempted to flee the camp.



Located 25 kilometers away from northwestern Daraa city center, Jilin is home to 500 families, mostly displaced from Palestinian territories occupied in 1948. A number of other families are from the occupied West Bank and the blockaded Gaza Strip.

Meanwhile, Tahrir AlSham battalion in Yarmouk Camp blew up an ISIS tunnel near Loubiya Street, sparking clashes inside the tunnel.

Simmering clashes between ISIS and Tahrir AlSham (formerly known as AlNusra Front) have rocked Yarmouk Camp Since early April 2016.

Some 3,000 Palestinians trapped inside Yarmouk have been enduring dire conditions due to the blockade imposed by the government forces on the camp. Over 10,000 Palestinian refugees displaced from Yarmouk to Babila, Yalda and Beit Sahem have also been grappling with tragic conditions after they were forced out of their homes, following ISIS takeover of the camp in early April 2015.



In another development, a Palestinian female refuge was kidnapped by the Syrian government forces at a checkpoint in Daraa. Her family decided not to reveal her name as they feared retaliation.

AGPS documented the incarceration of 1,187 Palestinians in Syria government lock-ups, among whom 87 female refugees.

At the same time, AGPS kept record of the death of 3,483 Palestinian refugees due to war-related incidents in Syria, 1,141 among whom as a result of the unabated shelling.

860 refugees died, meanwhile, in clashes between the government troops and opposition outfits. 461 others were tortured to death in government penitentiaries.

Palestinians of Syria: April 21, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,481 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,187 Palestinian refugees, including 87 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,373 days in a row.
- 195 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,104 and 955 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,448 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 182 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.

- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
