Recent Updates

The AGPS documentation and monitoring team documented 223 detainees from Al Aedein camp in Homs who are detained in the Syrian prisons since the beginning of the ongoing conflict.

The AGPS revealed that the 223 detainees include 213 men and 10 women who are unaccounted for till today.

The AGPS believes that the number of detainees is much bigger due to the absence of any official statistics issued by the Syrian regime, in addition to the fear of their families from the reaction of the Syrian security forces. There are 1097 Palestinian Syrian detainees who were documented by the AGPS since 2011, and who are detained in the prisons of the Syrian regime, while the AGPS managed to document.



In southern of Syria, artillery shelling targeted different parts of Deraa camp and resulted in only material damage, while violent artillery shelling also targeted Deraa Albalad neighborhoods which are inhabited by some Palestinian families; the shelling killed three children and

resulted in a state of fear and panic among civilians, as well as destruction of homes. The shelling also targeted Alsad neighborhood adjacent to Daraa camp and no reports of injuries.



In Damascus, a mortar shell landed on Al Wafedeen camp in Damascus suburb, where Palestinian families live along the Syrian families. The shelling resulted in only material damage.

Residents of the camp suffer of difficult humanitarian situations before the war in Syria, yet they suffered more after the war began, where unemployment is widespread and the financial resources is almost non exist for families, moreover they are suffering from the deterioration of the security situation because of the near location of the camp to Adra area which is witnessing continuous clashes between armed opposition groups and the Syrian regime.

In the meantime, the medical rescue center in Rija square, which is controlled by Fatah Alsham-Nusra- in the Yarmouk refugee camp, described humanitarian and health situation as bad, as a result of lack of food and potable water, due to the blockade imposed on the Rija area by ISIS on the one hand, and the Syrian regime forces on the other hand.

Dr. "Riad Idriss," supervisor of the center, spoke during video record on the social networking, the besieged people in Rija area were forced to drink stagnant water from the wells in the region, leading to the spread of some diseases such as chronic gastroenteritis and typhoid fever and infections of the upper respiratory tract and the spread of skin diseases and unexplained rashes..



Dr. Idris said that the percentage of diseases spread is 60% among the besieged residents which is a real epidemic, noting that the most vulnerable group of disease are children, especially under the age of 5 years, as they are suffering from abdominal pain and fever up to 40 degrees combined with diarrhea and in some cases, vomiting.

The besieged doctor confirmed that the region is suffering from complete absence of medical institutions and bodies, as well as severe shortages of medicines and medical supplies, noting that the center cannot receive a large number of patients.

It is worth mentioning that ISIS imposes a tight siege on dozens of families residing in areas under the control of Fatah Alsham- formerly Nusra-, where the main blockade is in the vicinity of Rija Square area,

Ain Ghazal, and Haifa Streets. The region is inhabited with more than fifty families of civilians, as well as families of "Fatah al-Sham" fighters.

Returning to the center of Syria, the Syrian security released the Palestinian refugee, "Mohamed Abdel Latif - Abu Ahmed," from Al Aedein camp in Homs, after being detained for 55 days in charge of similarity of names with someone who is wanted by the Syrian regime. He is in his fifties, and originally from Safed city in Palestine.

The AGPS monitoring and documentation team documented the data of 36 Palestinians, including 18 people from one family (Ghazi) family in the town of Zamalka, 7 in Muadamiyat al-Sham were killed on Wednesday, 21 August 2013 following chemical bombardment that targeted Zamalka and Muadamiyat al-Sham in Damascus. The chemical bombing claimed the lives of hundreds of residents of the area due to the inhalation of toxic gases resulting from nerve gas attack.



The AGPS pointed out that the 36 victims included 28 refugees have died following the chemical bombing at Zamalka area in Damascus suburb; the victims are:

Meanwhile, seven Palestinian refugees died following the chemical bombardment at Muadamiyat al-Sham area in Damascus suburb; they are: "Ahmed Mansour, Manal Mustafa Mansour, the child Hammam Nasser Mansour, the child Omar Nasser Mansour, Mohammed Nasser Al-Sahli, Ahmed al-Sahli, and Deeb Jameela.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 21\08\2016

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza

- More than 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till mid 2016
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1161 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1221 days, water was cut for 710 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 1013 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1204 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 864 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
