



"At least (452) female Palestinian refugees passed away because of the war in Syria"



- One of Yarmouk's camp residents passed away as a result of siege and lack of medical care.
- Clashes and artillery bombing targets Qudsya town which is the habitant of 6000 displaced Palestinian families.
- The people of Yarmouk camp have stopped sending their children to school because of ISIS dominance on it.
- Palestinians of Syria are protesting against UNRWA's decisions in Al Beqa'a area.

Victims

"Abo Naser Hammod", a Palestinian refugee who passed away due to the deterioration of his health, lack of treatment and the rising prices of medicine in the southern area.



A lot of social media pages, which are interested in reporting the news of Palestinians of Syria, like (Facebook) have launched an urgent call before several days to save "Abo Naser's" life who needed a (tpn) peripheral, central and intravenous bag. In the world of medicine, it's called (Venous Catheter). He needed it every 24 hours which costs 200\$. Unfortunately, the siege over the southern area and Yarmouk camp that was imposed by the Syrian regime and its allied Palestinian factions deprived him from taking his medicine and a free treatment expenses.


According to the documented surveys of Action Group for Palestinians of Syria, it's noteworthy that there are (187) victims among the Palestinian refugees, who passed away because of siege and lack of medical care.

Recent News

The statistics and documentation team, which works for the Action Group for Palestinian of Syria, confirmed that it has documented the death of (452) female Palestinian refugees till the date of 21st September 2016.



Returning to the causes of death, the surveys of the Action Group refer to the bombing, clashes and torturing till death inside the Syrian prisons, as main reasons behind those deaths.

The statistics and documentation team of the group points out to the possible increasing numbers of deaths. Obviously, this is because of the number of the unannounced victims in order to avoid the offence and discomforts of security officers towards the victims' families.

Moving to Damascus town, Qudsya town which contained 6000 displaced Palestinian families was bombed with heavy guns and mortars. Consequently, there was one victim and many citizens were wounded. At the same time, many of regime forces were killed as a result of the fierce

clashes between the armed groups allied with the Syrian opposition and the regime's forces.

Trapped people in general and Palestinian refugees in Qudsya town in specific are living a slowly killing siege more than a year. Meanwhile, the Syrian regime restricts the town and its people through preventing them getting in and out without well-defined conditions from the Syrian army and the security officers on the checkpoints. Not forgetting the operations of bombing and sniping in several areas of the town.

In the meantime, ISIS proceeds its series of strangling the trapped people in Yarmouk camp, where ISIS has been controlling it since the beginning of April 2015, when its crimes exceeded all the limitations even the final resort for students which are the alternative schools.

A few days ago, some activists confirmed that ISIS's men prevented the opening of the schools in the camp. To come later with a new obligatory curriculum to be studied.

From their side, the parents refused to send their children to those schools, where ISIS pumps its own ideas and thoughts.

The parents also stated that ISIS has closed a lot of schools and reduced them to one school for males near Al Khalil Mosque in Al Orooba Lane in the south of the camp and other one for females in the heart of ISIS's stronghold. It's a place called Al Hajar Al Aswad. It also set new curriculums for those schools.

On Wednesday the 21st September 2016, Palestinians of Syria have organized a sit-in in front of UNRWA's office in Al Biqua' area in

Lebanon. Refusing its last decision about delaying the financial dues' payment, which are compensations instated of food and place, for Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon for two months: September and October.



It's also worth mentioning that UNRWA managed to send massages to Palestinians of Syria reporting them about an exceptional postponing September's and October's financial dues payment to the middle of October due to the renewal of ATM cards. It also assured in its massage that another text massage will be sent in the next two days asking the paterfamilias who is registered with UNRWA to come and take his \ her new ATM card.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics until 21/9/2016

- (15500) Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan.
- (42,500) Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon.

- (6000) Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015.
- (8000) Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey.
- (1000) Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza.
- More than (79,000) Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till mid-2016.
- Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for (1191) consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than (1252) days. water was cut for (742) days respectively. The number of siege victims is (187).
- Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still forbidding the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for (1044) days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about (1236) days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost (894) days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were totally destroyed.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hammah: to some extent, a quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
