### **Recent Updates**

The Syrian warplanes launched violent raids yesterday that targeted Tarieq Al Sad neighborhood adjacent to Daraa camp, which caused civilian casualties and severely damaged homes. The neighborhood inhabited with many Palestinian refugee families who have fled from the camp.



Residents of Daraa camp south of Syria are suffering from shelling and repeated clashes since the beginning of war, which caused, according to unofficial statistics, the destruction of about 70% of the camp's buildings, while the AGPS documented 224 victims who died since the beginning of war events.

The remaining residents are suffering of very serious health and living situations, in addition to the continuous water cut for 579 days.

It is worth mentioning that news comes late from the camp and its vicinity because of the poor security situation and the difficulty of communications there.

In a related context, a number of residents from Khan Al Sheikh camp in Damascus suburb were injured after being hit by three mortar shells at least in the western part of the camp.

According to activists, the shells were launched by the Syrian military site "Talet Kabouseia," coincided with warplanes raids that targeted the vicinity of the camp, including a raid shook civilian homes and landed in Al Noufali Farm.

Meanwhile, helicopters dropped an explosive barrel in the vicinity of Al Zohour Street, causing a state of panic and fear among people, especially women and children.



It is noteworthy that the regular army checkpoints continue closing all roads linking the camp and the center of the capital, Damascus, forcing residents to take the dangerous sub-road (Khan Al Shieh - Zakya) to get to Damascus, where that road has been frequently targeted with shells and heavy machine guns.

It is worth mentioning that Talet Kabouseia military site became an obsession for the people of Khan Al Shieh camp because of the harm that

they have suffered from that site, where shelling by tanks and heavy artillery.

The AGPS has documented 141 victims from Khan Al Shieh camp; most of them died by shelling.

On the other hand, a four-year-old child had dehydration as a result of diarrhea and lack of medicines in the Yarmouk refugee camp, where she was transferred to the Medical Surgical Center in the camp and received the available treatments.

A number of medical personnel and residents of the Yarmouk camp had appealed to those concerned, in order to allow the entry of medicine and drugs of typhoid fever and jaundice to the south of the capital Damascus.

The appeals came after the loss of drugs that was entered in 04.09.2015 by the Negotiating Committee, where the disease still exists.

Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon organized a first aid course in collaboration with the Medical Care Center in Bedawi camp, according to those in charge of the session, the number of participants reached about 40 trainees of the displaced Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon.

It is worth mentioning that about 45,000 Palestinian refugees, who displaced from Syria to Lebanon to escape the ongoing war in Syria, are suffering from large economic and living difficulties, especially with regard to obtaining residence and work.

### Numbers and Statistics till 21/11/2015

- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 873 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 943 days, water was cut for 433 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 184 victims.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 734 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 935 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 579 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
