#### **Victims**

The Palestinian refugee Abdulrahman Jubran, 25 years died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime after being detained for more than a year. The news of his death was reported by a released detainee, while the AGPS could not assure the news from other resources.

### Recent Updates

Tens of residents of the Yarmouk refugee camp south of Damascus carried out solidarity demonstrations with Deraa and Khan AL Shieh camps which are being subjected to frequent shelling with missiles and explosive barrels. Residents of Yarmouk expressed their solidarity with the family of the child Muneir Hajeina who died by a gun shot in Beirut during a funeral of a member of the Lebanese Hezbollah.



A state of quietness prevailed among the camp since of the beginning of the Holy month of Ramadan, while the humanitarian situation is deteriorating due to the stoppage of entering food aid and the continuous cut of power and water for several months all over the camp.

Meanwhile, the AGPS received news reported that ISIS and Al Nusra Front are stealing the assets of Jennen sports club and transfer it to the adjacent neighborhood of AL Hajar Al Aswad.

Meanwhile, Syrian authorities ended building and installation of the iron fence that separates between the neighborhoods of Al Aedein camp in Homs, university mass, and university campus at the western side, and neighborhoods of Al Waleed suburb, Ikrima, and Wadi Al Thahabin the eastern region

The fence is to be along Al Sham way, starting from Tadmor square till Al Timthal square at Al Jesser crossing and Al Hadara Street without any service corridors between the two sides.

Our correspondent confirmed that the iron fence put new obstacles to communication between residents and their relatives in neighboring areas, where they became forced to go to the south across Tadmor crossing to return to Damascus Road, which doubles transportation costs, especially on students, employees, and residents who have a review with UNRWA dispensary and Bisan hospital.

He pointed out that the fence would adversely affect the shopkeepers in the eastern neighborhoods, who may lose all of their customers from the west. About the reasons of building such fence, our correspondent noted that the reason is related to security in order to ensure protection of neighborhoods of the eastern region loyal to the regime.

In the meantime, residents of Al Aedein camp in Hama, who receive a large number of displaced families from various camps and cities of Damascus, Aleppo, Idlib, Hama suburb, Deir Al Zour, AL Riqa, Deraa, and Latakia, are living a state of relative calm compared to the rest of the Palestinian refugee camps in Syria,

However, they suffer from a strict security cordon imposed by the regular army at the entrances and exits of the camp, in addition to raids and arrests campaigns carried out by the regular army between now and then.

In terms of the economic side, residents are complaining of unemployment spread due to the tense security situation, which cast a shadow on them, who are mostly lost their work and become completely dependent on relief aid that is distributed between now and then.

#### **Detainees**

The AGPS documented 12 Palestinian detainees from Al Muzareb compound in Deraa at the prisons of the Syrian regime, including a woman, while their fate is still unknown yet.

It is worth mentioning that Muzaireb town south of Deraa camp is inhabited with almost 8500 Palestinian refugees, in addition to a number of families who were displaced from Deraa camp. The AGPS documented 896 Palestinian detainees in the prisons of the Syrian regime since the beginning of war events, including 36 detainees' women, and their fate is still unknown yet, as the Syrian security forces still preserved their fate.

#### Released

The Syrian security released two Palestinian refugees from Al Aedein camp in Homs; they are: Muaiad Riyad Awad, in his thirties, and who was released on 14th of June, and Umran Khalil Darweesh, in his twenties, and was released from Homs Central Prison on 18th of June after being detained for about a month. It is worth mentioning that the two refugees are originally from Al Shajara village in Palestine.

In the same context, and after a week of detention by a checkpoint of air security which is located in the south after Hama city and before Mork area, the Syrian security released three refugees from AL Aedein camp in Homs; they are: Nabil Abdulsalam Salayma, Shadi Haitham Qasim, and Tala Mohammed Abdullah, who are originally from Al Shajara village in Palestine.

It is noted that the AGPS has documented the names of 35 detainees from Al Aedein camp in Hama at the Syrian prisons; their fate is still unknown yet.

#### Lebanon

Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon in cooperation with Al Quds Charity Committee distributed a number of food rations yesterday to the Palestinian Syrian families at Al Bidawi camp. It is worth mentioning that the number of Palestinian Syrian Families who are inhabited at Al Bidawi camp has reached 850 families out of 45,000 Palestinian Syrian Refugees who have fled to Lebanon escaping the ongoing war in Syria.

### **Turkey**

Palestinians of Syria Committee in Turkey implemented a visit for 12 displaced Palestinian families in Istanbul city —Turkey, aiming to check on their suffering, pains, and living conditions. At the end of the visit, the committee provided the families with financial aid. It is worth mentioning that there are families share one house as a result of scarcity of financial resources, and difficulty of finding a job.

#### Numbers and Statistics till 21/6/2015

- 80,000 Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The number of Palestinian detainees who were documented by the AGPS has reached 896 detainees, and 398 victims were killed due to torture in the Syrian prisons.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 724 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 794 days, water was cut for 284 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 176 victims.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 605 days respectively.

- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 586 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 788 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 431 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL SaiedaZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
