"Two Palestinians Died in Syria, and ISIS Steals One of the Main Power Generators in Yarmouk"



- Aerial Shelling Continues Targeting the Vicinity of Khan Al Shieh Camp Amid Fears of Directly Targeting the Camp
- The Charity Committee Carries out Iftar for Orphan Children at Qudseia Town
- Food Baskets Distribution to a Number of Palestinian Syrian Families Displaced at Wadi Alzeina
- All Neighboring Countries Continue to Hinder the Entry of the Palestinians of Syria into its Territory

Victims

The young man, Mohammed Yusef AL Khateib, from Alwafedein Ccamp, died while fighting alongside Nosour Alzawbaa'a Formations, which are affiliated groups to the Syrian Regular Army. He died during the ongoing fighting at Alriqa town near Al Tabaqa airport.



The refugee, Isam Tameem, from the Yarmouk camp, also died by a sniper shot of ISIS which controls large parts of the Yarmouk camp in Damascus.

Recent Updates

Activists confirmed to the AGPS that some members of ISIS stolen one of the main power generators in the Yarmouk camp that is located at the Jarmaq School. The generator was providing power to the adjacent houses after the Syrian Regime cut off power for more than 3 years.





Meanwhile, the Palestinian refugee, Isam Tameem, from the Yarmouk camp, died by a sniper shot of ISIS which controls large parts of the Yarmouk camp in Damascus.

Turning to the western Ghouta of Damascus, where the outskirts of Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb are still exposed to heavy and frequent aerial bombardment, which intensified rapidly during the past few days.

The AGPS correspondent confirmed that the warplanes use various high destructive powers of bombs and rockets, which have caused considerable material damage in the neighboring farms.

Our correspondent added that residents fear of being directly targeted if the situation continues to evolve, especially as the warplanes had targeted the camp several times during the past few days.



In the meantime, Charity Commission for Relief of Palestinian People implemented yesterday an Iftar for the orphans in the town of Qudsaya in Damascus, where the Iftar included "250" children with relatives.



It should be noted that the town of Qudsaya in Damascus suburb receives about 6,000 Palestinian families displaced from the camps to the town.

Al Salah Society distributed food baskets to a number of Palestinian Syrian families displaced to the Wadi Alzeina southern Lebanon, with the aim of alleviating the pain and suffering of their living and economic conditions.

It is noteworthy that the number of Palestinian Syrian families displaced in Wadi Alzein southern Lebanon is about 450 families, out of about 12 thousand Palestinian Syrian families who fled to Lebanon to escape the war in Syria.

In the meantime, the neighboring countries of Syria continue to prevent the entry of Palestinian refugees into its territory, in spite of the poor security situation in Syria, despite also making the life of refugees, who fled from the war and the siege, vulnerable to risk of death.

Jordanian authorities prevent the entry of Palestinian Syrians into territory under any reason, after the Jordanian government issued a formal decision in that regard.

The Lebanese authorities set conditions described by the refugees as crippling to allow them to enter its territory. Activists confirmed that the refugees who have papers to prove that they have family reunion interview in European embassies are only allowed to enter Lebanon or those who have booked to travel through Beirut airport.

The Turkish embassy in Beirut has suspended issuing visas of Palestinian refugees from Syria, since more than two years, while some Turkish



embassies in the Gulf countries continue to issue visas for the Palestinians of Syria who have residences in the Gulf States.

Rights activists believe that these actions will put the lives of the Palestinian refugees in endanger, and this is contrary to international laws and norms relating to the protection of refugees during wars and crises

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 21\06\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1102 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1163 days, water was cut for 653 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 956 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 147 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*

- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 808 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
