Turkey

A number of Palestinian families from Syria in Turkey launched an appeal demanding to help the families to get a decent life a Kilis city south of Turkey after closing the shelter that they were living in and the cut of all aid. In the appeal the AGPS received, the families referred to that most of concerned parties abandoned them in the time there are no choices whether to be exiled to Mardin camp which is similar to a military location and to return back to Syria and for what it contains of risks on their lives.

In a call with Mr. Z.A, the spokesperson of the 99 families, he clarified to the representative of the AGPS that Mardin camp is like an exile because to is isolated and so far of the population centers where there are no job vacancies. He insured that they want help and to find jobs in the same time. Mr. Z.A demanded the Turkish Government to shelter them in centers that are near the Turkish cities and towns. He put the responsibility on the Public Refugees Commission to move to let this succeed and expressed his hope of that the Arab and Turkish associations will move to help the families and provide them with alternatives that sustain their dignity and secure them stability.

The refugee T. E who is inside Mardin camp, insured that the camp is located in a desert area with cruel nature and the level of services is so low such as water is not clean, and the prevention of telecommunications in addition to the sand regarding the nature of this area and the situation of the camp, he referred the school is the same clinic in one place at the same time.



It is mentioned that the families were living at the shelter center of the Public Commission for the Refugees of the Syrian Opposition. The center witnessed many of financial and managerial difficulties ended with closing the cap in agreement with the Turkish government and moving the Palestinians of Syria refugees to the Mardin camp which is 400 KM far to the west near Al Qameshly Syrian City border.

Statistics

The AGPS Monitoring and Documentation team declared that 51 Palestinian refugees died out of Syria, including 15 refugees in Egypt, 6 in Malta, 7 in Greece, 7 in Lebanon, 4 in Turkey, 3 in Palestine, 2 in Italy, 4 in Libya, , 1 in Sweden, 1 in Cyprus and 1 in Macedonia.

Victims

The refugee Moahmmmed Tawfeeq was found killed in his house at Al OurobaStreet in Yarmouk camp where the AGPS was unable to know the killer.

Recent Updates

Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees southern of Damascus witnessed a calm state coincided with sounds of explosions due to clashes between ISIS alongside with NUSRA against the Regular Army in Al Tadamun neighborhood.

The relatives of the detainee Mohammed Hasan Abu Shnar appealed the Fatah Movement and PFGC to work to release him from the Syrian prisons. It is mentioned that the Syrian Security arrested Abu Shnar 38 years since 27 October 2012 and he is from Al Tadamon neighborhood in Damascus, he is married and has three children.

The Regular Army and the Palestinian factions still prevent the residents of Al Sbeina camp to return back to their houses for 526 days. The residents were forced to leave due to violent clashes between the Opposition and the Regular Army which ended with the full control of the Regular Army over the camp. Estimates refer to that about 80% of the buildings and houses are partially damaged specially in the area between Moath Bin Jabal mosque and the camp's oven which is known as the Kurdish Oven and forms the western entrance of the camp. The residents left their houses to the neighboring towns and camps to enter a new suffering that didn't stop till leaving their houses but increased to include all life aspects which turned to tragedy due to the difficult economic situation, the spread of unemployment and the weak financial resources.



Under the consequences of war and the bad economic situation, many of the camp's residents resorted to out of Syria, the UNRWA estimates refer to that the refugees percentage of refugees of Al Sbeina camp in Lebanon reached about 8.21% of the total number of the refugees. The number of refugees in Lebanon is about 50000 refugees.

In Damascus Suburb, the residents of Danoun Camp complain of the high cost of living and the high prices of food materials in addition to the high cost of rent houses inside the camp due to the high rate of displacement into the camp from the other camps who were obliged to leave due to the bombing and siege. The crowd in the camp led the residents to share the houses for more than one family because of the high cost of rent houses. The camp suffers of the shortage of the basic services, where it already suffers of the shortage of public services such as health, medicine and transportations. The unemployment is spread amongst the residents of the camp due to the security tension in its vicinity which led to make the aid of the relief organizations as the only source for securing their basic needs.

Civil Work Committees

The Palestine Charity Commission for the Relief of the Palestinian People in Cooperation with the International Relief and Konna W Sanabqa organization distributed relief aid on the families that were displaced from Yarmouk camp after the ISIS incursion to Zainab Al Helaleyya school and the organizations provided the displaced families



with food meals, sweets and Infants milk in partnership with the Syria Trust for Development and Al Quds Charity Association.

Germany

The Organizations that work for Palestine in Europe continue their preparations for the 13th conference of the Palestinians of Europe, which will be held in Berlin the capital of Germany on 25th of April titled as “The Palestinians of European and the Palestinian National Project”. Mr. Adel Abdullah, the Secretary General of the Palestinians of Europe Conference, said earlier that all the Palestinian organizations in Europe are deeply concerned for the Palestinians of Syria suffering where they did their best to help them, to be in solidarity and to explain about their suffering in the international forums. Mr. Adel Abdullah mentioned that they have decided a wide space in the conference to shed the light on the suffering of the Palestinians of Syria whether the sieged people of Yarmouk or who suffer of the consequences of war in the countries that they fled to.



The Conference and European organizations performed during the last few months the European solidarity week with the Palestinians of Syria that included seminars, workshops and solidarity sit-ins in Berlin and Dortmund in Germany, London the British capital, Vienna in Austria, Malmo in Sweden and Lahaye and Rotterdam in Netherland in addition to sending some letters and reports that explain the suffering of the Palestinians of Syria to the European Union, the British Government, the United Nations High Commission of the Refugees Affairs and the European Parliament.

It is worth to mention that the conference will include an opening speech about the suffering of the Palestinians of Syria, displaying a film about the tragedy of the Palestinians of Syria, honoring Mr. Ayham Ahmed, the Pianist, and displaying one of his songs, distributing publications and statistics for the suffering of the Palestinians of Syria.

In the same context, titled as a Cup of Coffee, Mr. AnasSalama, the Palestinian Artist, will open his plastic Arts exhibition in Berlin the Capital of Germany. The exhibition will include 350 paintings by Mr. AnasSalama that shed the light on the suffering of the Palestinians of



Syria at Yarmouk through some artistic paintings he painted using the remains of the Arab Coffee. Mr. Slama said that he tried to document the pain stories in each house and street especially at the Yarmouk camp and generally in Syria, moreover, he painted them in a visionary method through using the remains of the coffee. Each painting documents a humanitarian case that he saw at Yarmouk camp and he added that the paintings are like diaries tell about the day story and the events that happened in this day. He continued that the Palestinians of Syria were exposed to a disaster and new diaspora and is considered the worst disaster that happened since 1948. Mr. Salama mentioned that he painted about 350 paintings most of them are about Yarmouk camp and after the bombing and the immigration of its residents he could get out about 150 paintings of his work. It is mentioned that the exhibition will be included in the events of thirteenth Palestinians of Europe Conference that will be held on 25th of April 2015 at Berlin the capital of Germany.

Numbers and Statistics till 21/4/2015

- *At least **27933** Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- ***The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for **655** days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than **735** days, water was cut for **225** days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to **174** victims.*



- **80,000** Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including **10,687** refugees in Jordan, **51,300** in Lebanon and **6,000** refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.
- **Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **555** days respectively.
- **Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **526** days respectively.
- **Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for **728** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- **Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost **372** days without water and **70%** of its buildings were demolished.
- **Jermana, AL SaiedaZainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- **Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
