Recent Updates

The Palestinian child, Mohammed Qasem Al Tiraani, from Deraa camp south of Syria, died during the ongoing violent fighting in the vicinity of the camp between the Syrian armed opposition groups and the Regular Army. Meanwhile, the AGPS monitoring and documentation team documented the data of 200 Palestinian children who died due to the shelling since the beginning of the ongoing conflict in Syria.



The Palestinian refugee, Abdullah Omar Ali, a PLA officer, died due to clashes that broke out between the Regular Army and the Syrian armed opposition groups in the Eastern Ghouta in Damascus suburb.

The PLA military service of the Syrian Regular Army is an obligatory service for every Palestinian refugee in Syria, which forced the youth, who refuse to join the military service during the ongoing war in Syria, to travel to the neighboring towns.





On the other hand, news from Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus western suburb reported that the Regular Army in the regiment 137 targeted the camp with a rocket that landed on a house. The shelling resulted in the injury of a child. In addition, the Regular Army also targeted civilian houses in the eastern vicinity of the camp without any damages.

The Regular Army continues to close Zakia-Khan Al Shieh road that linking the camp with the Syrian capital of Damascus, as well as to prevent the entry of medication, food, and bread causing many crises, especially bread.

It is worth mentioning that more than 12,000 Palestinian refugees and a number of Palestinian Syrian families, who are displaced from other conflict areas, suffer of dire conditions in light of the severe siege imposed over them.



The Syrian security released the Palestinian refugee, Yahya Fouad Abbas, from Al Aedein camp in Homs, and still detaining 186 Palestinians still unaccounted for, while some of them died due to torture. This comes in light of the continuous suffering of the residents of AL Aedein camp in Homs, who are suffer of severe harassment practiced by



the members of the Syrian security detachment. The members launch arrests, inspection, and audit campaigns for the passers-by IDs, as they impose royalties, which force the residents to migrate outside the country.

Meanwhile, the Syrian security released the Palestinian woman, Hekmat Ahmed Hasan, from Khan Al Shieh camp, after being detained for almost nine months, noting that her husband died due to torture, and her father is still detained in the prisons of the Syrian regime for about a year.

The security agencies continue to arrest 106 Palestinians from Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb, including 2 women still unaccounted for in the prisons of the Syrian regime.

It is worth mentioning that the AGPS documented the names of 1076 Palestinian refugee detainees in the prisons of the Syrian regime. The Syrian security agencies are still reticent about the detainees' fate despite the ongoing demands to release them and to reveal their fate. The detainees include children, women, elderly people, siblings, parents, and entire families, while hundreds of them died due to torture.

Turkey

The Palestinian Return Center 'PRC' implemented a cultural seminar yesterday evening under the title: "The humanitarian situation of Palestinian refugees and political solutions" during the World Humanitarian Summit Conference, held in the Turkish city of Istanbul, which highlights the plight of Palestinian refugees in the Diaspora in general and the Palestinians of Syria in particular.



During the Summit to be held over two days, Head of the Palestinian Return Centre, Majed Al Zeer, will talk about "humanitarian suffering of the Palestinian refugees in the camps," while the British House of Lords member Baroness Jenny Tong, will talk about "the financial crisis of UNRWA, the future of the solution, and the role of the United Nations.



The regional coordinator for the Palestinian Return Center in the Arab region, Ali Huwaydi will focus in his lecture on "the suffering of Palestinian refugees in Lebanon and the suggested solutions," the Palestinian researcher in the field of human rights Amani Sinwar will deliver a lecture entitled "the humanitarian situation of the Palestinian refugees in the camps, poverty with a case study."

For his part, deputy chairman of the justice and development Party in Turkey and the prominent political Yasin Oktay will talk about the role of the international community in providing permanent solutions to the problem of Palestinian refugees.

It should be noted that the Secretary-General of the United Nations Ban Ki-moon opened the agenda of the World Humanitarian Summit



Conference, held in the Turkish city of Istanbul on Monday morning 23-5-2016 with the participation of more than 80 heads of state, non-governmental organizations, other organizations of the United Nations, and media, academic, and cultural figures.



Civil Work Committees

The Charity Committee for the Relief of the Palestinian Refugees, in cooperation with the Islamic Relief around the World, launched the project of Physical and mental health awareness for the students of the educational program of Afaq. The project included the families of the Palestinian Syrian, the Lebanese, and the Syrian students. According to the operators of Afaq Center, the project will last till February 2017, two lectures monthly. Professional professors will deliver the lectures, which will include distribution of incentives for families, as 75 women health bags were distributed after the end of the first lecture.

Afaq educational center was opened on 5th of March 2016 at Wadi Al Zina area, al Kharoub in Lebanon. The center aims at serving the



Palestinian Syrians and the Syrians who are displaced in Lebanon, and to raise the intellectual and scientific level of the Palestinian people, to be a scientific beacon shining the road of displaced Palestinian Syrian and Syrian children, and to save them from the darkness of ignorance caused by the war in Syria.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 23\05\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1073 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1134 days, water was cut for 623 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 927 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1118 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 780 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*



- *Jermana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
