Recent Updates

The Palestinian Syrian refugee, Ahmed Hinawi, from the Yarmouk camp in Damascus, who is detained at Kuala Lumpur airport in Malaysia, appealed what he described as decision-makers of the PLO, the human rights organizations, and the UN to work for his release from Kuala Lumpur airport. He was detained for more than 4 days, as he stressed the need to find urgent solution for his problem before being deported to Syria as it poses a threat to his life.

It is noteworthy that dozens of Palestinian Syrian refugees suffer from difficulty of obtaining legal residency in Malaysia, due to the tightening of the Malaysian laws relating to residencies.



In a different context, the AGPS correspondent in Aleppo reported that the regular army targeted Handarat camp with firebombs, coincided with the outbreak of violent clashes between the Syrian armed opposition groups on the one hand and "al-Quds Brigade" alongside the regular army on the other hand, as the latter tries to break into the camp with little progress.

It is noteworthy that the camp is completely empty, where residents were forced to leave their camp following violent clashes that broke out between the regime and the opposition forces before about (1147) days, which ended with the opposition's control over the camp.

The Syrian armed opposition forces prevented the return of residents to the camp since then, while the camp was repeatedly shelled with explosive barrels throughout that period, which resulted in the destruction of approximately 80% of the camp's homes.



Furthermore, the regular army, the PFGC groups, and the pro-Syrian Regime Palestinian groups continue besieging the Yarmouk refugee camp for more than (1100) days respectively. The siege impacted negatively on the people in the camp, where the regular army and the affiliated groups cut off water and electricity, prevent the introduction of food and medical supplies, etc., and prevent the exit or entry of residents from the main entrances of the camp which are controlled by groups of the Syrian security forces and Palestinian groups.

Frequent shelling and continuous blockade resulted in the stoppage of all hospitals and clinics, while a number of medical staff died by bombing and mortars. The breaking of ISIS into the camp has aggravated the suffering of residents, as ISIS controlled the camp supported by Nusra at the beginning of April 2015, where many relief agencies left the camp following ISIS threats.

A number of families experience a new siege after they were trapped in the clashes areas that break out between ISIS and Nusra in the alleys of the camp, and the difficulty of providing food and drinking water, especially with the spread of snipers, burning of houses, and the explosion devices.

Clashes, hit-and-run operations, and explosion of tunnels continue between ISIS and Nusra, which led to a number of deaths and wounded in the ranks of the attacking forces, while the Nusra restored some buildings were seized previously by ISIS.

Lebanon

The 25-year-Palestinian Syrian dancer, Hasan Rabih, committed suicide on Wednesday morning, 22nd of June, as he threw himself from the balcony of his apartment that is located at Hamra Street in the Lebanese capital of Beirut.

According to Hassan's friends on social network sites, he suffered from psychological and neurological difficult conditions during the last two years in Beirut, after the events in Syria forced him to leave.

The number of Palestinian Syrians in Lebanon has exceeded (42.5) thousand refugees, and they suffer from unclear legal situation, and harsh living conditions with very few job opportunities and high rent of houses.



Civil Work Committees

The Palestinians of Syria Workers League in Lebanon implemented a project of lighting the houses of Palestinian Syrian refugee in Lebanon under the sponsorship and funding by institutions and charities, including Danish Crescent Charity, Al Wafaa European campaign, and Al Rahma Austrian Association. The project came as a move aimed at alleviating the suffering of the displaced Palestinian Syrians as a result of difficult economic circumstances which they suffer.

The League implemented the project of lighting in Sidon and its camps after the implementation of several projects in the Beqaa, Tripoli northern camps, and Beirut camps.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 22\06\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1103 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1164 days, water was cut for 654 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 957 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1 148 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 809 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
