Victims

An ex-detainee who was recently released from the government-run Palestine Branch detention center said the Palestinian refugee Khalil Ubaid, a resident of AlRaml Camp, in Latakia, died under torture in December 2013.

The ex-detainee said he had last met Ubaid on May 8, 2013, in an underground cell at Palestine Branch.

AGPS kept record of the incarceration of 82 Palestinians from AlRamal Camp in Syrian government lock-ups.

Latest Developments

AGPS English and Arabic pages on Facebook reaped a tick check mark, which is a sign of the group's credibility and professionalism.

The two pages are stage-managed and supervised by a team of administrators, journalists, and editors who share a deep concern over the tragedy of the Palestinians of Syria.

Over 1,753 daily reports and 70 statistics-based studies have been issued by London-based AGPS to document the situation of the Palestinian refugee community in war-torn Syria.

According to AGPS data, 3,553 Palestinian refugees from Syria died of war-related incidents, 1,630 others have been held captive, while 304 have gone missing.

AGPS is a London-based human rights watchdog that monitors the situation of Palestinian refugees in war-torn Syria. It saw the day in October 2012, following a workshop held by the Palestine Return Center (PRC) to discuss the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria.

AGPS material is purely fact-based and rooted in real data compiled by a team of professional journalists, on-the-spot reporters, news correspondents, veterans, and local activists. The group is dedicated to bringing the news of the Palestinians of Syria to a wide audience without bias or a political agenda.

As warfare drags on in war-torn Syria, AGPS staff members have taken it upon their shoulders to keep a moment-by-moment record of latest developments in Palestinian refugee camps in Syria.

In another development, opposition troops deployed at the Yalda checkpoint have banned the entry of food items, except for bread and milk, to Yarmouk Camp.

Reports have recently emerged on underway attempts to close off the checkpoint. The reasons for the projected move remain unknown.

Meanwhile, The National Coalition for Syrian Revolution and Opposition Forces, commonly named the Syrian National Coalition, cut off aids to local clinics in Yalda town and Babilla. Both facilities are run by the General Health Commission south of Damascus.

Activists warned of the repercussions of the move on hundreds of displaced families and sick civilians who have been left on their own in the poverty-stricken area.

Yalda and Babilla resource-deprived clinics have served as the only health facilities for hundreds of patients south of Damascus.

In the meantime, an ex-detainee said he had met the Palestinian refugee Mohamed Salah Abu Bakr at the government Military Police Prison in Qaboun, in Damascus.

He added that Abu Bakr, jailed for the third consecutive year, is in good health.

Palestinians of Syria: August 23, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,559 Palestinians, including 462 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,628 Palestinian refugees, including 103 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,489 days in a row.
- 197 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,256 and 1,075 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,571 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 324 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria fled to Europe until the end of 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
