#### **Victims**

Palestinian child Taha Mohamed Hussein died due to the lack of medical care in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.

Taha succumbed to the lesions inflicted by an electric shock that hit him a couple of years ago, causing him cerebral palsy.

The casualty breathed his last on November 23, 2016 at noon time after he caught a heart stroke.

Meanwhile, reports have emerged on the death of the Palestinian refugee Nael Abd Al-Raheem earlier last month after he was kidnapped by ISIS battalions in Aleppo's northeastern city of Al-Bab.



### Latest Developments

Two Palestinian refugee children sustained wounds after remnants of a cluster bomb unleashed by the Syrian fighter aircrafts on Khan Al-Sheih Camp a couple of days ago blew up.

Over the past few weeks, the Syrian and Russian warplanes showered Khan Al-Sheih Camp, in Damascus western suburbs, and its adjacent ranches with the internationally prohibited cluster bombs and phosphorus incendiary grenades, killing several civilians and leaving others wounded.



Meanwhile, the Syrian government troops have kept a tight rein on all accessroads into Khan Al-Sheih Camp for Palestinian refugees for 56 days running. As a result, civilians have run out of basic food items and life-saving medicines.

Human rights reports have warned of an imminent health crisis to rock the camp due to the torrential blitzes launched by the Syrian regime warplanes.

In a related development, residents of Al-Sbiena Camp for Palestinian refugees, to the south of Damascus province, called for a safe access to their homes, from which they had been displaced due to the deadly hostilities between the government army and the opposition outfits.

Al-Sbiena Camp has been under the full control of the government troops since November 7, 2013.

The calls were launched during a follow-up visit paid by Al-Quneitra Governor to the rural Damascus towns of Al-Dhiabiya and Al-Sbiena on Wednesday in an attempt to keep tabs on reconstruction works. The visit reportedly aims to set the stage for the return of the displaced refugees to their shelters, according to state-run news outlets.

The Al-Sbiena displaced residents and local activists spoke out against the apathy maintained by the Syrian government and the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO), among other political factions, as regards their tragic state of affairs and their cries for help.



### Palestinians of Syria: November 23, 2016 Statistics:

- There are 15,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Jordan.
- 42,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are in Lebanon.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt, according to UNRWA figures covering the period from July 2015 backwards.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.

- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees reside in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
- Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,254 days in a row. Electricity and water supplies have been cut off, respectively, for 1,313 days and 774 days. The number of those killed due to the blockade has hit 190.
- Sbiena refugee camp: Refugees could not go back to their homes as a result of the blockade slapped by the Syrian regime forces since 1,107 days running.
- Handarat refugee camp: All refugees left the camp since 1,299 days after opposition outfits grabbed hold of the area.
- Deraa refugee camp: Water has been cut off for 957 consecutive days while 70% of its buildings have been knocked down.
- Homs camp, Hama camp, Jaramana camp, al-Sayda Zeinab camp, Al-Raml camp: A of State of relative calm has been reported in the abovementioned areas. However, economic crises have been on the rise.
- Khan al-Sheih refugee camp: All access roads out of and into the camp have been closed off by the Syrian regime army for 56 days running.
