Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"The regime forces bombard Deraa camp and the Sad Road neighborhood with mortar shells"

- Sniper attack in Street 15, in Yarmouk camp, Damascus
- Outstanding Palestinian-Syrian students in Damascus, honored
- Syrian regime continues to detain dozens of females Palestinian refugees



Latest Developments

The regime forces centered in Deraa, used a number of mortar shells to bombard the neighborhoods of Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees in south Syria, and the Sad Road neighborhood yesterday night, causing destruction to the residents' houses.

More than 80% of Deraa camp's buildings have been completely or partially destroyed, while the remaining residents of the camp and the Sad Road neighborhood are complaining of the harsh humanitarian conditions, resulting from the siege imposed by the regime's army, on the camp and its neighboring areas.



Meanwhile, Street 15 in Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus, witnessed a sniper attack. According to ISIS's pages, which controls large areas inside the camp, one of its snipers targeted a member of "Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham" - previously known as Al-Nusra - however our correspondent in the camp could not confirm the reports from other sources.

ISIS had taken control over the camp in the beginning of April 2015, with the help and support of "Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham" - previously known as Al-Nusra Front.



In another context, the General Authority for Palestinian Arab Refugees honored a number of excellent, Palestinian-Syrian students in Damascus, who are enrolled in the primary and secondary stages at the Authority's institutes for the academic year 2016-2017.

Thousands of Palestinian-Syrian refugee students have been prevented from their right to education because of the Syrian war. A number of schools in Yarmouk camp, Deraa and Muzayrib have been subjected to bombardments.

In the meantime, the Syrian regime continues to detain dozens of females Palestinian refugees in its prisons, most of which are youth, in addition to families where both the mother and her daughters are taken, such as the "Mawlood Khaled Al-Abdullah" family. Members of the Syrian regime arrested the whole family on 27-07-2013.

Testimonies of the released detainees from the regime's prisons confirm that the Syrian security forces practice all forms and types of torture. "Hoda," a female detainee who has been released told of extremely harsh details, documenting the details of the detention and torture of women in the Syrian regime's prisons.

Palestinians of Syria: December 23, 2017 Statistics:

 The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3625, including 463 women

- 1644 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,620 days in a row
- 204 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1357 days, and 1197 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,693 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 456 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
