Victims

Palestinian refugee Amjad Mohamed Abu Hamed, a resident of AlRaml Camp in Latakia, died of wounds he sustained in an onslaught launched by the Syrian government forces on Jabal AlTurkman, in Latakia suburbs.

AGPS documented the death of 53 Palestinians from Latakia Camp since the outburst of the conflict in Syria.

Latest Developments

195 Palestinian refugees from Syria died since the start of 2018 until July due to war-related incidents.

13 Palestinians were pronounced dead in January, 21 in February, 23 in March, 45 in April, 32 in May, and 30 in June. As many as 50 Palestinians died in July.



Meanwhile, over 150,000 Palestinians from Syria have spent the holy occasion of Eid AlAdhha (Feast of Sacrifice) away from their homes and families.



Torn from the nourishment of home and warmth of family, Palestinians have been scattered across Lebanon, Jordan, Egypt, Turkey, Libya, Sudan, Thailand, Malaysia, Sweden, Denmark, Germany, Britain, the Netherlands, Finland, Switzerland, France, Brazil, Chile, and Canada, among other destinations. Hundreds have become internally displaced across the Syrian territories.

According to unofficial figures, over 150,000 Palestinian refugees have become displaced outside of Syria.

The situation has gone downhill after most of the world's countries opted for a closed-door immigration policy vis-à-vis the Palestinian refugee community from Syria.

Hundreds have embarked on life-threatening journeys onboard the death-boats to Europe, having no place to take cover in.

In the meantime, the Charity Commission for Relief of Palestinian People continues to distribute meat portions to Palestinian families in Damascus and its outskirts for the fourth consecutive day.





A few days ago, meat portions were handed over to Palestinian families displaced from Yarmouk Camp in Yalda, Babila, and Beit Sahem, south of Damascus.

Thousands of displaced Palestinian families have been grappling with dire living conditions due to the price leap and lack of access to the labor market.
