Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"In extreme silence: a delegation from 'Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham' leaves Yarmouk camp, to negotiate with the regime"

- Explosive devices are a source of great concern among the people of Muzayrib, south Syria
- 18601 Palestinian-Syrian people in Lebanon, according to the results of the Palestinian Population and Housing Census Project
- Athens' Municipality announces measures to protect refugees from cold weather



Latest Developments

The Action Group's correspondent reported the news of the exit of a delegation of 'Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham' from Yarmouk camp, to the capital Damascus, to negotiate with the Syrian regime. The topics to be discussed have not been clarified.

'Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham,' one the the armed Syrian opposition factions, had previously confirmed that Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees is the fifth town over which the agreement was signed, between the Syrian regime and "Jaish Al-Fath," in what is known as the agreement of the "Four Towns."



The agreement states that "the first phase of the agreement requires the provision of food and medical assistance to the areas controlled by "Tahrir Al-Sham" in Yarmouk camp, and allow the urgent health cases to leave, in addition to the fighters and those who wish to leave from the residents of Yarmouk camp, during this stage."

In south Syria, the residents of Muzayrib are in a state of major concern, due to the proliferation of explosive devices planted in the



town. According to our correspondent, the armed Syrian opposition forces carried out a security campaign in the town, to remove the devices.

Our reporter added that the armed factions blame ISIS's groups that are sleeping alongside the security groups affiliated to the Syrian regime and the Foreign Intelligence Services, with an aim to carry out assassinations targeting the leaders and members of the armed opposition groups.

In general, the areas occupied by the opposition in south Syria, Muzayrib in particular, are seeing an increase in the number of assassinations targeting the residents of the area. One of the residents described these actions as threatening to the town, especially that the performer and organization behind the actions are unknown, amid the security chaos in the complete region.

In Lebanon, the final results of the "General Population and Housing Census in the Palestinian Camps and Gatherings in Lebanon" campaign, performed by the "Lebanese-Palestinian Dialogue Committee," in coordination with the Lebanese Central Administration of Statistics and the Palestinian Central Bureau of Statistics, have proved that the number of refugees in Lebanon is 174442 people in 2017, living in 12 camps and 156 Palestinian gatherings in the five governorates of Lebanon.

The General Population and Housing Census that the number of Palestinian refugees displaced from Syria to Lebanon is 18601 people, which is equivalent to 8487 families, of which 2202 are living in Palestinian camps, 1055 families are living in the gatherings



adjacent to the camps and 1199 families are in different places in lebanon. The statistics noted that the 8487 Palestinian-Syrian families are distributed across the Palestinian camps as follows: 1523 in Ain Al-Helwa camp, 253 families in the Miye ou Miye camp, 1444 families in the Borj El-Chmali camp, 560 families in the Rashidiya camp, 412 families in the Buss camp. In the camps on Beirut, 537 families are living in the Shatila camp, 687 in the Borj El-Chmali camp, 55 families in Mar Elias refugee camp, 55 families in the Dbayeh camp. In the city of Tripoli, 1637 families are in the Beddawi camp, 1015 families are in the Nahr Al-Bared camp, while in the city of Baalbeck, the statistics showed that 626 families live in Wavel camp.



The statistical results of the "General Population and Housing Census in the Palestinian Camps and Gatherings in Lebanon" show that the Palestinian-Syrian families are distributed across the five Lebanese cities as follows: 9.1% in Beirut, 11.3% in Beqaa, 21.8% in Tripoli, 15.3% in Tyre and 7.1% in Chouf.



The number of Palestinian refugees from Syria in Lebanon, according to UNRWA's statistics at the end of December 2016, is estimated at 31 thousand.

In another context, the municipal authorities in the Greek capital Athens, announced its measures to protect the refugees and other poor categories in the capital, from the cold weather.

The municipal authorities stated that a heated hall will be open for the people, in the Athens Culture Center, located in the Academy Street, on Friday 22-12-2017 at 10pm, and that those in need can call the helpline 1595 for information.

The authorities also said that the municipal groups will be active in the city, in search of the homeless to provide them with blankets, clothes and information about the organized shelters that will accommodate the refugees and homeless people.

While thousands of refugees, including more than 500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees, are living in difficult conditions on the Greek Islands, awaiting the decision of their transfer to the capital, Athens.





Palestinians of Syria: December 24, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3625, including 463 women
- 1644 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,621 days in a row
- 204 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1358 days, and 1198 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,694 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 457 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
