### ***Recent Updates***

*Children make up 26,04% of Palestinian victims who died as they fled the Syrian territories; 73,96% are adults, AGPS found out*

*The list of casualties includes 39 women, amounting to 40,62% of the death toll, and 57 men.*



*AGPS documented the death of 96 Palestinian refugees on the migration road during the period between July 2012 and April 2017.*

*AGPS believes that the exact number of casualties is far higher as the bodies of several victims who drowned onboard “the death boats” to Europe and other destinations have not been pulled out.*



*Meanwhile, rocket-propelled grenades slammed into AlWafideen Camp, housing a number of Palestinian families.*

*Located some 20 kilometers away from Damascus, AlWafideen Camp has been subjected to a security mayhem and a dire socio-economic situation as a result of the sporadic onslaughts rocking the camp.*



*In the meantime, residents of Khan AlSheih Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Rif Dimashq, joined on Wednesday a series of events staged in solidarity with the Palestinian hunger striking detainees in Israeli jails.*



*Dozens of Khan AlSheih residents flocked to a sit-in tent set up in the camp in support for the Palestinian detainees who have been starving for over a month's time in Israeli prisons to press for basic rights.*



*In a related development, the Palestine Charity Commission embarked on a so-called “Ramadan Basket” campaign for the Palestinians of Syria.*

*The move aims to provide 5,000 Palestinian refugee family in war-torn Syria with food parcels worth 35\$ each.*

*The commission also announced the launch of the 2017 central cookery to provide 200 displaced families and orphans with meals during Holy Ramadan month.*



*In another development, Palestinian refugees from Syria sheltered on Greek islands have sounded distress signals over the exacerbated humanitarian conditions they have been subjected to.*



*Palestinian refugees in Greek said they have been enduring medical neglect and poor hygiene, along with the lack of relief assistance and the propagation of poisonous reptiles in the makeshift tents they have been locked up in.*

*According to unofficial statistics, 400 Palestinian refugees, mostly from the Syrian camps of Daraa, Yarmouk, AlAydeen, and AlHusseiniya, have been stranded in makeshift tents and under-equipped halls on such Greek islands as Lesbos, Chios, Leros, and Kos*

### ***Palestinians of Syria: May 25, 2017 Statistics:***

- *At least 3,501 Palestinians, including 461 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,603 Palestinian refugees, including 99 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*



- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,405 days in a row.
- 196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,136 and 987 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,480 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 214 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
