## **Latest Developments**

15 Palestinians, among them a woman, taking refuge in AlMuzeireeb area in Daraa have been enduring mysterious fates in Syrian state prisons.

AlMuzeireeb town, south of Daraa, is home to nearly 8,500 Palestinian refugees along with dozens of families who were displaced from Daraa Camp.



Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Firas Khaled AlShaabi, born on March 8, 1989, has been held in a Syrian state prison for the fourth year running.

A resident of AlAyedeen Camp in Hums, Firas was kidnapped by the government forces on January 18, 2015 near Bilal Mosque, to the southeast of AlAyedeen Camp in Hums.

According to AGPS data, 234 Palestinians sheltered in AlAyedeen Camp in Hums have been secretly held in Syrian state dungeons.

At the same time, the family of the Palestinian young man Shadi Mahmoud Deib Mansour continues to appeal to the national



and international human rights institutions to work on disclosing the condition and whereabouts of their son.

Shadi, aged 20, went missing on January 9, 2016 in AlBab, in Aleppo, north of Syria, as he attempted to illegally enter the Turkish territories.

The family said they were recently notified that Shadi is held in Sakarya prison in Turkey. The family could not verify the news.

Meanwhile, Palestinians taking shelter in AlAyedeen Camp in Hama have been facing a deteriorating humanitarian situation as a result of the price leap, absence of stable financial resources, the sharp shortage in fuel supplies, the frequent power blackouts, and absence of humanitarian assistance.

High rates of unemployment and the security turmoil rocking the region have made the situation far more alarming.
