Victims

Palestinian refugee Yassin Ahmed Hamour, from AlAyedeen Camp in Hums, died in a Syrian state prison, where he had been locked up for years.

AGPS documented the death of 588 Palestinian refugees in Syria's government-run penal complexes, mostly due to harsh torture.



Latest Developments

A Grad missile reportedly landed in AlGharaf neighborhood, in AlRaml Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Latakia, leaving two civilians wounded and inflicting heavy material damage.





Sources close to the Syrian government said the missile was fired from opposition-held zones in Latakia suburbs.

Tension hit a zenith in AlRaml Camp after Syria's pro-government outfits broke into the camp in mid-August 2011 and launched violent onslaughts on the area. Several residents were arrested and others tortured to death in government detention centers.

In another development, three-year-old Palestinian child Teym Samer Jamil Surur returned to his family six days after he had gone missing.

Teym disappeared on April 18 while he was outside of a local bakery in Sakhnin Street in Jaramana Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Rif Dimashq. His family kept appealing for information over his condition and whereabouts.

At least 323 Palestinian refugees, including 37 women and girls, have gone missing in war-torn Syria, according to AGPS database.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugees who fled war-torn Syria to Gaza joined a vigil held outside of the UNRWA office to protest delays in shelling out rental allowances, which they said have not been delivered for nearly one year.





Some 1,000 Palestinian refugees fled war-ragged Syria to the Israeli-blockaded Gaza Strip, where they have been enduring dire living conditions due to the socio-economic crises rocking the enclave and the absence of humanitarian assistance by such relief bodies as UNRWA.
