Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"In flagrant violation, the cruel forces of the regime kill a child for his objection of the looting of his home in Yarmouk camp"

Victims

Palestinian refugee "Mohammed Ahmed Qassem," a member of the Commandos loyal to the Syrian regime, has died while fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces.

The Action Group has documented dozens of deaths of members of

Palestinian armed groups, while fighting alongside the forces of the Syrian regime.

Latest Developments

In a blatant violation of human rights and the rights of children, the cruel forces of the Syrian regime in Yarmouk camp killed the child, Mahmoud Al-Bakr, in an attempt to prevent the regime forces from looting the contents of his house in Yarmouk camp.



Local sources said that they shot and killed him in Al-Orouba Street, next to the Carmel Stove, on the sight of the pro-regime, General Command and Fath Al-Intifada organizations.



The ongoing looting and thefts carried out by the regime forces and the factions affiliated to it, are coordinated by senior officers of the Syrian army and security in Damascus.

On the other hand, the Syrian regime checkpoints in Yarmouk camp allowed a number of residents of Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees to enter it, in order to inspect their houses that have been hit by shelling and looting during the past period.

Pages close to the Syrian regime published a picture of a few refugees who entered the camp inspecting their destroyed homes, as well as pictures of a gathering of dozens of cars at the entrances of the camp, where hundreds of refugees are waiting to be allowed into the camp.



In the same context, the police chief of the regime in the city of Damascus, Mohammed Kheir Ismail, announced in a press statement that: "The internal security forces operate 24 hours a day and are ready to welcome citizens and listen to their complaints, demands and organize the necessary controls," noting that the members were distributed across all the points in the camp and roads, to maintain security and order and to restore the role of the internal security forces after the camp was liberated.



While the police chief called on those wanting to inspect their houses, to refer to the branch for an entry permission into the camp, after presenting the basic documents proving ownership. "Ownership evidence and if the identity card is not available or the electricity or water subscription is not available, and if no document is available, the local Mukhtar and witnesses will be asked to organize the necessary controls regarding the destruction or damage caused to their homes by terrorist attacks."

Yarmouk camp was subjected to an intensive military campaign launched since 19 April, causing massive destruction in civilian homes, in addition to dozens of victims and casualties. The campaign ended last Monday, with the regime's full control of Yarmouk camp, which was followed by the looting of refugee homes and properties by elements and officers of the Syrian regime.

In a press statement to one of the media outlets, Anwar Abd El-Hady, Director General of the Palestinian Political Department of the Palestinian Liberation Organization, confirmed that these ideas are being coordinated with the Syrian government, noting that in the case of a collaboration with UNRWA, as a responsible body for Palestinian refugees, together with the Syrian state and the Palestine Liberation Organization, these ideas will be adopted and a call will be made for a donor conference to make donations for the reconstruction of Palestinian camps and its neighboring Syrian areas.

Abd El-Hady noted that the idea of a "donors' conference" is currently being discussed with all parties concerned, expecting to



reach appropriate scenarios, stressing that the expected costs of reconstruction of the camps require specialized technical committees, before announcing realistic figures.

The PLO had previously announced, on the tongue of "Ahmed Majdlinai," Member of the Executive Committee of the Organization that "the Palestinian leadership attaches special importance to the consideration of convening an international conference to finance reconstruction, in partnership with related parties and specifically the Syrian Government as it is the host country.

The Secretary-General of the Palestinian Popular Struggle Front, Khalid Abd El-Majid, said that there are also operations to remove landmines and rubble in Yarmouk camp, expecting that after the clearance of the mines, the competent authorities will open the road to Yarmouk camp.

Abd El-Majid added in a statement he made to AL-Watan Syrian newspaper, that three parties will participate in the rehabilitation and reconstruction of the camp. They are the Syrian state, UNRWA - the Palestinian Authority represented by the Palestine Liberation Organization, under the supervision and coordination of the state.

Abd El-Majid pointed out that the areas of the center of the camp, Yarmouk Street and Palestine Street will return and become housed, and that 50-60 percent of the buildings can be repaired and some of them are suitable for housing, while others are partially demolished and the remaining part is also suitable for housing.



The fighters of the Popular Struggle Front, the General Command and Fath Al-Intifada are participated in the fighting alongside the forces of the Syrian regime. The Action Group has documented the deaths and injuries of Palestinians in its ranks.

Palestinians of Syria: May 25, 2018 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3761, including 466 women
- 1677 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,771 days in a row
- 206 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1506 days, and 1355 days in Yarmouk Camp
- The Regime army has been in control of Handarat camp for more than 602 days. More than 80% of its buildings have been completely or partially destroyed.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016, while 31 thousand refugees are estimated to be in Lebanon, 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan, 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt, 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey, and one thousand Palestinian-Syrians are in Gaza.
