Victims

Palestinian refugee "Ahmed Hany Al-Barhoumy" has died in a bombing carried out by ISIS of the Kansarwa plant, yesterday. This came amid great tension in the area due to the ongoing clashes between ISIS and the armed Syrian opposition groups in south Syria.



Latest Developments

Sources have confirmed to AGPS the release of the 23 year old Palestinian refugee "Ahmed Al-Barhoumy" from the Kurdistan Iraq prisons. The resident of Khan Al-Sheih camp in the Damascus suburbs was detained in mid-September while attempting to reach Turkey through Kurdistan.





The sources added that the security forces informed Al-Barhoumy that he will leave Kurdistan Iraq on Thursday 26-10 to an unknown country. The sources expect that he will be displaced to Lebanon.

The Lebanese authorities usually deport Syrian Palestinian refugees as soon as they arrive at the Rafic Al-Hariri Airport towards the Syrian border, without taking into account the psychological state of the displaced refugee and the risks they may face when entering Syria.

In south Syria, ISIS attacked the armed Syrian opposition factions in the Kansarwa plant, located in the town of Al-Muzayrib in the suburbs of Deraa, leading to a large explosion which resulted in a number of casualties.

The town, which is home to hundreds of Palestinian families, saw an unprecedented alertness by the armed Syrian opposition groups, amid the night curfew that was imposed due to fears of more attacks by ISIS.

In another context, Palestinian students "Yara Ahmed Saleh" and "Sarah Al-Hams" who were displaced from Khan Al-Sheih camp to Sweden received two medals for excellence and creativity, in a global competition for mathematics and technology, that was held in the South Korean capital, Seoul.

On its part, UNRWA held an Employment and Education Forum at the Damascus Intermediate Institute in Al-Mezzah area in Damascus, in cooperation with Masarat Company for Exhibitions and Conferences, with the aim of helping the youth in finding job



opportunities, upgrading the level of training and raising the efficiency of the trainees, through the transition from school to the working stage.

UNRWA explained that the idea of holding an Employment and Education Forum came due to the widespread of unemployment in Syria and the lack of job opportunities. The Forum is also a link between companies that need employees and the youth segment in search for jobs. UNRWA also noted that the idea was not limited to the organization of a recruitment forum, but evolved to assisting and guiding the job seekers on how to enter the labor market and writing a CV through organizing workshops and lectures.



Palestinians of Syria: October 25, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3605, including 462 women
