Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"Murder, arrest, abduction and sexual violence are among the most prominent violations against Palestinian women in Syria"

- ISIS's "Hesba" device in Yarmouk camp destroys the evil
- The Charitable Association starts its seventh medical week in Khan Al-Sheih camp



Latest Developments

AGPS has confirmed that the Palestinian woman in Syria has been subjected to arrest, abduction, death, disability or even sexual violence, as a result of the conflict in Syria since the outbreak of confrontations there in March 2011, between the sides of the Syrian crisis, in a clear violation of the provisions of heavenly laws and status, which prohibited the killing or harming of the human life in general.



According to AGPS, 464 Palestinian women have died since the beginning of the war in Syria, of which 431 died on the Syrian territory and 33 women died outside Syria. The Action Group notes that Palestinian women have been victims of the siege, bombardments, bombings, assassinations, sniping and clashes.

Regarding the detentions, AGPS asserted that not one of the Palestinian refugee camps hasn't had women arrested from them, who were stopped at the checkpoints located at the gates and entrances of the camps and cities. According to the Action Group's



statistics, 105 Palestinian women have been detained to this point. 33 women have been released, of which 4 were released after an agreement between the Syrian army and the Free Syrian Army.

The Group added that the Palestinian woman in Syria lost the protection guaranteed by international laws and covenants, during the armed conflicts, by being subjecting to death with all the tools used in fighting, both normal and internationally prohibited weapons such as chemical weapons, in addition to rape, sexual slavery, detention and enforced disappearance, without being able to obtain fair trials guaranteed to those detained by law.

The Group calls for an effective action at all national, regional and international levels, towards ensuring the return of the lost protection and revealing the fate of the detainees, as well as maintaining their dignity and restoring their prestige, according to the social and human status that women hold in society.

The group also demands that war criminals be brought to justice and punishment under the prescribed laws, as stipulated in the Geneva Conventions, in the third common article of the four conventions.

In another context, the Palestinian families living in the town of Hayt in western suburbs of Deraa, are suffering from difficult security and living conditions, because of the ongoing clashes between the armed opposition factions and the Khalid ibn Al-Walid battalion, which is affiliated to ISIS.

According to our correspondent, ISIS is trying to repeatedly invade the western side of Hayt town, attacking it with heavy machine guns,



in addition to the area where mines are deployed as a clash zone, which has led to the death of a number of the town's residents.

Our correspondent pointed out that the town of Hayt includes 15 Palestinian families, due to the continuous fighting between the factions and the Khaled ibn Al-Walid battalion, affiliated to ISIS.

The residents are also suffering from harsh living conditions, due to ISIS's attempt to impose a siege on the area, with an aim to take control of it, in addition to the high prices of materials, the spread of unemployment and the lack of financial resources.

Pictures published on ISIS's official website show its "Hesba" device, in Yarmouk camp, as it destroys the evil, as they put it.

In the same context, ISIS launched a detention campaign in 2016, in which a number of residents of Yarmouk camp were detained. On 28-07-2016, almost 50 civilians from the camp for smoking in public places. ISIS also detained all of those who were arrested while smoking for a maximum of five days a minimum of one day.





ISIS performed a number of violations towards the civilians inside the camp, after it became in control of it in April 2015.

In the meantime, the Charitable Association for Palestinian Relief, in cooperation with the Palestinian Red Crescent, began its "Seventh Medical Week" activities in the Khan Al-Sheih refugee camp for Palestinians in the suburbs of Damascus.

The Association said that the medical week program includes (general health, cardiology, internal and pediatric) clinics and with the participation of 6 doctors for the treatment of patients. 171 patients have benefited from the program, who were covered by a medical examination and free medicine.

Palestinians of Syria: November 25, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3613, including 463 women
- 1643 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,592 days in a row
- 204 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1329 days,
 and 1169 days in Yarmouk Camp



- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,665 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 428 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
