



Latest Developments

Dozens of displaced Palestinian families who have been deported from southern Damascus to northern Syria appealed, during a vigil staged in Deir Ballout on Monday, to the human rights institutions and concerned authorities to work on granting them asylum in Turkey or a European destination as a result of their dire conditions in the poverty-stricken area.

The displaced refugees stressed their commitment to their right of return to their motherland—Palestine, saying a temporary solution should be found until they gain safe access to their homes.



The refugees said they will keep up protest moves until their demands are met, urging the international human rights bodies and mass media to pop in the camp so as to keep tabs on their abject living conditions.

Hundreds of Palestinian families who have been displaced from Yarmouk Camp have been struggling for survival in northern Syria owing to the lack of much-needed services and equipment.



Meanwhile, AGPS documentation team found out that over 150,000 Palestinian refugees have fled the Syrian territories, where 650,000 Palestinians used to take shelter prior to the outburst of the deadly warfare.

Over 60% of Palestinians from Syria have undergone displacement for at least once all the way through the eight-year conflict.

According to AGPS data, over 30,000 Palestinians have sought refuge in Lebanon. 17,000 others fled to Jordan; 6,000 have sought asylum in Egypt; 8,000 in Turkey; 1,000 refugees returned to the Israeli-blockaded Gaza Strip.

Dozens of Palestinian refugees from Syria also drowned at sea onboard the Europe-bound migrant boats.

In the meantime, the family of the Palestinian refugee Mohamed Issa AlHourani reiterated their appeals to the international human rights institutions to work on disclosing the whereabouts and condition of their son who has been locked up in Syrian state jails.





Born in 1982, AlHourani was kidnapped by Syrian government forces in November 2013 from Daraa AlBalad. His fate and whereabouts have been shrouded in mystery.

In another development, AGPS kept record of the death of 145 Palestinian refugees in Yarmouk Camp during ISIS control of the area from April 2015 until the launch of the Syrian military operation on April 18, 2018.

Dozens of Palestinians were killed under shelling and others died as a result of undernourishment and medical neglect. Several bodies, including those of activists Jamal Khalifa and Abdul Latif AlRimawi, were spotted in public parks after their families failed to reach local cemeteries.

According to AGPS figures, 67 Palestinians died during the same period in shooting attacks while 24 refugees were gunned down by snipers. 22 Palestinians were also pronounced dead as a result of the blockade and lack of medical care; 18 were killed under shelling; Nine Palestinians were subjected to extrajudicial field execution; Two refugees were assassinated; One refugee was killed in a blast and another drowned at sea. One more refugee died of unknown reasons.
