

Recent Updates

Hundreds of Palestinians of Syria students renewed their demands to the Lebanese Ministry of Higher Education to allow their students to register for the official exams in Lebanon, they stressed on putting an end to their sons and daughters suffering where the ministry imposes, according to the families, getting the regular Lebanese residency to be allowed to register for the exams where the government refuses to give them those residencies.

In the same context, Hamas Movement called in a statement the Lebanese government to settle the Palestinians of Syria students' positions in Lebanon after they were prevented to be register for the official exams, moreover, the statement stressed on the necessity for dealing with Palestinians of Syria refugees as human cases international recognized and not to treat them as security files. The statement, which is published by the Refugees Affairs Office of Hamas movement in Lebanon, expressed the amazement of not allowing the students to register for the official exams and stressed on treating the roots of the problem that started not to consider them as refugees in the Lebanese departments as a result they treat the refugees in vague ways. The statement also demanded the minister of Education in Lebanon to fix the problem through issuing an exception for the students that are included in these procedures.

On the other hand, the refugees Marwan Al Amayeri and Omar Hamdan from the Yarmouk camp were recognized yesterday from the leaked pictures for the torture and kidnap victims in the Syrian Regime prisons.

It is mentioned that the AGPS published a report titled "the Massacre of Pictures" that documents the torture and compulsory disappearance victims of the Palestinian refugees who were recognized through the leaked pictures that were published in the beginning of this month. The report referred that amongst thousands of the leaked pictures, 38 Palestinian refugees were recognized who disappeared without knowing their place or who arrested them of the Syrian security departments. The number is just for those who were recognized till 19 March and it is

expected to be raised where the search is still going on amongst the leaked pictures.

The suffering of Al Husayeneyya camp's homeless residents continues. It is mentioned that the Regular Army and groups of the Palestinian factions control the camp since 17th of October 2013, where the checkpoints of the Regular Army, the PFGC groups, Feth Al Entifada and Al Nedal front close the entrances of the camp and prevent its residents to return back to their houses, moreover, the residents live in severe living crises where they were distributed on the neighboring countries and they were obliged to rent houses with high prices which increased their economic burdens.

In Hama, the suffering of Al Aedin camp for Palestinian refugees is concentrated on the two sides; economy and security, where the young people of the camp live in worry state fearing to be arrested due to the spread of the Army checkpoints inside and outside the camp which prompted many of them to leave the camp especially those who are in the age of the compulsory military services.

In terms of economic aspect, the residents complain of the spread of unemployment due to the tensed security situation which affected the camp's residents who lost their work and they became completely dependent of the relief aids that are distributed once in a while.

In Damascus, the Palestine Charity Commission continues to provide its services to the Palestinian besieged people inside the Yarmouk camp who

are besieged for more than 627 days, where the services department continues cleaning the streets and collecting garbage in one point to be transferred later as an attempt to stop the spread of diseases amongst the residents. The Charity Commission also continues to provide its medical services and securing water for mosques and the elders' houses.

Numbers and Statistics till 25/3/2015

- At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 627 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 707 days, water was cut for 196 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 172 victims.
- 80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 528 days respectively.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 498 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 700 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 344 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
