





Recent Updates

The AGPS Documentation and Monitoring Team clarified that 14% of the Palestinian victims who died during the ongoing war in Syria are females, where 451 female victims died between 2011 and March 2016.

It is mentioned that the Statistical Report was published within the comprehensive statistical report which documents the Palestinians of Syria victims and detainees between 2011 and March 2016 that will be published on the AGPS website soon. The Report includes detailed statistics according to date, place, camp, and causes of death in addition to graphs and points.



The Report also includes sorting of the Palestinian victims who died in Syria according to gender and age in addition to detailed statistics about the militants which are categorized according to factions that they were fighting for. It is mentioned that the AGPS documented till today 3213 victims.

On the other hand, the number of the explosive barrels that targeted the vicinity of Khan Al Sheih camp in Damascus suburb on Monday and

Tuesday reached about 15 barrels. The bombing led to a fire in the farms . The AGPS correspondent insured that the bombing targeted Al Abaseyya area, Al Qusour and Autostrad Al Salam areas and some parts of Al Saed street and Al Thanaweyya street, coincided with violent clashes between the armed groups of the opposition and the Regular Army.



It is noted that Khan Al Sheih camp was exposed to artillery bombing the day before from Tal Al Kabousa which is controlled by the Regular Army that led to the death of the 6-year-old Child Omar Amer Abu Hamda, and injured 12 people from the residents of the camp. The bombing targeted the western neighborhood and the only clinic in the camp while a group of people were in the clinic for vaccination of their children. The bombing also targeted Al Thanaweyya Street, the old market and the main street.

In a different context, after 900 days of displacement from Al Sbeina camp, activists, dignitaries, and residents of the camp renewed their demand to return back to their houses and properties. They also mentioned that the Regular Army and the loyal Palestinian factions are still preventing them from entering the camp though their control over the

camp since 7/11/2013. They continued that they were forced to leave due to violent clashes between the Opposition and the Regular Army, Moreover; they live in difficult situations due to the bad economic conditions and the spread of unemployment and the weak financial resources.

In the same context, some activists, who were able to enter Al Sbeina camp, insured that 80% of the streets and houses of Al Sbeina camp are destroyed specially the area between Mouath Bin Jabal Mousqe and the Camp's Oven which is known as Al Akrad Oven that forms the western entrance of the camp. They also mentioned that the rest of the area till the UNRWA schools needs rehabilitation and their position is better. The activists added that the houses that were not destroyed and owned by opposition were burnt and most of the houses only contain the heavy furniture.



In a different context, the UNRWA declared its intension to distribute financial aid for the second round of 2016 to the Palestinians of Syria refugees beginning from 2/5/2016 and ends in 23/6/2016. The UNRWA will give each member of the family 28000 SP where it will give 14000 SP

for each member of the family who live in the shelter centers. UNRWA mentioned in its statement that there are no lists for the difficult cases "Rations" but for the families if the regular lists.

It is noted that UNRWA carried out auditing for its single information of the Palestinian refugees in Syria who didn't get in the previous rounds aiming to make sure of the availability of all beneficiaries of the financial aid in Syria in addition to updating their information and the size of the benefited family in Syria.

It is mentioned that the Palestinians of Syria refugees live in harsh and miserable situation under displacement operation, high prices, spread of unemployment, and high prices of rent houses in addition to detention and victims of the ongoing conflict in Syria.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 26\04\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- 8000 Palestinians of Syria Refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinians of Syria Refugees are in Gaza Strip
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1046 consecutive days. Power cut continued for

more than 1107 days, water was cut for 596 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 186.

- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 901days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1094 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 754 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
