"Clashes Continue at Yarmouk, and ISIS still Attempts to Break into Al Ja'ouna"

Victims

The 18-year-Palestinian refugee, Abdul Menim Hamdan, died in Al Ramousa area in Aleppo Suburb, while his brother Fateh was injured due to snipers shooting while they were crossing the road. They are from Al Nairab camp for Palestinian refugees in Aleppo.

Mahmoud Amra died while participating in the fighting alongside the Syrian Regime Forces against the Syrian Opposition, raising the number of deaths among the Palestinian refugees in Syria, since the beginning of the ongoing events, to 3266 victims, according to the documented statistics of AGPS.



Recent Updates

News from the Yarmouk camp reported that ISIS tried again to break into Al Ja'ona neighborhood which is controlled by Al Nusra Front. ISIS used Shelka tanks and burnt the buildings and shops in the vicinity of Lubia square near Al Ja'ouna borders.

Sources inside the camp reported that Al Nusra Front used heavy and middle weapons to fending off the invasion of ISIS and killed 20 members of ISIS, where ISIS was able to control two buildings in Al Ja'ouna neighborhood while invading Al ja'ouna from different sides.

Activists accused ISIS of coordinating with the Syrian Regime, as they confirmed that ISIS members closed Palestine Street for the second time and put a huge cover in front of the regime and the soldiers of Yarmouk municipality, they also separated the streets to tighten Al Ja'ouna neighborhood situation and to carry out its plans to withdraw from the camp in exchange for leaving Al Required.

Al Ja'ouna area witnesses intensive attempts by ISIS to invade the camp to completely control it. The two sides are digging tunnels, ditches and opening the houses of the camps to escape the snipers bullets, they both plant explosive bombs and burn houses to stop the other side from going forward.



In Al Tadamoun area near Yarmouk camp, violent clashes broke out between Opposition forces and Regime forces in Nisreen Street "National Defense" near Al Iskan buildings.

In Aleppo, the AGPS correspondent reported that the young man, Abdul Menim Hamdan, 18 years, died in Al Ramousa area in Aleppo suburb and his brother Fateh was injured after being targeted by snipers shooting while they were crossing the road; they are from Al Nairab Camp for Palestinian refugees in Aleppo.

Al Ramousa road is considered one of the dangerous roads, where it is targeted once in a while with shells and snipers which led to stop the movements of the residents from Al Nairab camp such as the employees, workers, and university and institutions students in Aleppo fearing of the snipers' bullets.

In the western Suburb of Damascus, Jafra organization for Relief and Youth Development carried out Iftar campaign for a number of families in Khan Al Shieh camp. According to the organization members, the campaign continued for 2 consecutive days in order to alleviate the economic burdens of the residents.

The field reports of AGPS inside Khan Al Shieh camp indicated that a big number of residents are unemployed and depend on the irregular and limited aids because the camp is considered a sieged area.

On a different context, the Lebanese Security released yesterday the Palestinian Syrian refugee Ahmed Farouk Jom'aa, 18 years, from Yarmouk camp after arresting him on 17-6-2016 due to a similarity in names. They arrested him while he was leaving Burj Al Barajna to Anan Street which is adjacent to the camp from the eastern side.

Closed people to Jom'aa said that he is in a bad health situation after he was exposed to beat, hit, and insult by the Lebanese members during his detention period.



It is mentioned that AGPS published earlier an appeal for the relatives of the refugee Ahmed Farouk Jom'aa after he was missed in a few hours, they called the PLO, the Palestinian Factions in Lebanon, and the Lebanese authorities to search for their son and to know his fate but no one cared about him, according to his family.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 26\06\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza

- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1104 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1166 days, water was cut for 655 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 958 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1 150 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 811 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
