"The Syrian Security Forces Arrest and Execute 4 Refugees from Al Aedein Camp in Homs"

Victims

The Syrian news agency of the regime published yesterday photos of the refugees "Wisam Al Sayed, Ramy Subheia, Ahmed Al Sheabi, and Abdul Razzaq Amayri" who were executed after they surrendered to the Syrian Security Authorities, which implemented wide raid campaigns in Al Aedein Camp in Homs yesterday.



According to a resident previous testimony, the Syrian security forces arrested each of "Wisam Al Sayed, Ramy Subheia, Ahmed Al Sheabi, and Abdul Razzaq Amayri" after the security forces threatened them with their families forcing them to surrender in condition of not harming their families.

It is mentioned that the four refugees have settled their situation with the Syrian security forces within a group of youth in the camp before three months in the framework of an agreement between the Syrian security forces and the armed groups mediated by the Palestinian factions in the camp.

However, the Syrian security forces had raided their house and arrested them after clashes that ended with their surrender, then the Syrian security executed them, where the official news agency of the Syrian regime published images of the bodies of four refugees after they have been executed as they were killed during clashes with Syrian security forces, which were denied by more than one source inside the camp, as the sources emphasized that the refugees were not killed during the clashes but were executed after their arrest.

The refugee "Mohammed Haitham Al Sayes", a resident of the Yarmouk camp, and was born in (1959), died due to malnutrition because of the siege imposed by the Regular Army and groups of the Popular Front - General Command, for 600 days, raising the toll of the siege victims, that was documented by the AGPS to 169 victims.

Recent Updates

It is now 600 consecutive days of the strict siege imposed by the Syrian Regular Army and the PFGC groups in light of the deteriorated living and health crises inside the Yarmouk camp.

All hospitals and clinics have stopped working due to the acute shortage of medical supplies and cadres except for Palestine Hospital that works with its minimum capacity.

Meanwhile, the toll of shelling, clashes, and siege victims was raised to 1105 victims, including 169 victims died due to malnutrition and lack of medical care because of the continuing siege of the Yarmouk camp.

The water cut in the houses of the civilians in the Yarmouk camp for 170 days, while power cuts for 680 days.

It is mentioned that the checkpoints of the Regular Army and the GC prevent the entry of any urgent relief, food, or medical aid, provided by

the international organizations to the besieged residents of the Yarmouk camp for more than two months.

A mortar shell targeted Khan Al Shieh cam in Damascus suburb resulted in only material damages.

The residents of the camp are still suffering of the high prices and the unemployment, while hundreds of the Palestinian families were displaced to the camp due to the shelling, the clashes, and the siege that targeted their camps.

Sporadic clashes and shelling targeted the surrounding towns of Khan Al Shieh camp at Al Salam highway, while all roads linking the camp with the surrounding places are still closed except for Zakia-Khan Al Shieh road.

The thing that was reflected negatively at the availability of fuel and food supplies inside the camp, moreover, many kinds ran out of the camp due to the difficulty of reaching the camp.

On the other hand, the PLA funerals yesterday three of its members who died during the clashes in Syria; they are: the corporal Ismat Ismael Ahmed, and the two soldiers Ramiz Al Sabbagh and Jameil Mohammed Dakhl Allah.

The funeral was launched from Teshrein military hospital in Damascus headed to Al Sanamein military hospital in Daraa city.

It is mentioned that the number of the PLA victims that was documented by the AGPS has reached 118 victims.

The Palestinian refugee "Abdullah Merwan Abu Hashim", a member affiliated to the Syrian opposition, from Handarat camp was injured during the clashes that broke out in the south suburb of Aleppo, as he was transferred to a hospital in Gaziantep city in Turkey.

Meanwhile, frequent clashes and shelling in Daraa camp resulted in the destruction of almost 70% of its buildings since the beginning of the war in Syria, according to unofficial statistics, while the rest of its residents are living in severely dangerous humanitarian situation manifested in the living and the health aspects.

In terms of the health aspect, there are no hospitals or medical clinics in the camp, in addition to the severe shortage of medicine, medical materials, and first aid materials, moreover, the unavailability of ambulances to carry the wounded out of the camp for treatment.

It is mentioned that the Regular Army snipers obstruct the ambulances to get in the camp and if the residents succeeded to get a patient out of the camp, Jordan refuses the entry of the Palestinians of Syria refugees to its lands even if they were injured.

The activists warned from the spread of diseases inside the camp amongst the residents especially because they are drinking from the contaminated water due to the water cut since about 317 days.

In terms of living, the residents of Dar'aa camp suffer of the frequent power cut for long periods and days.

The residents also suffer of the unavailability of fuel and heating materials in addition to the loss of some food items and the high prices of the other materials.

It is worth to mention that the frequent bombing and the difficult living situation forced hundreds of Palestinian families from the camp to resort to the neighboring countries.

Numbers and Statistics till 26/2/2015:-

- At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 600 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 680 days, water was cut for 170 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 169 victims.
- 80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 502 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 471 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 673 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 317 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
