Latest Developments

AGPS kept record of the names of 84 Palestinian refugees killed outside the Syrian territories, 17 among whom in Libya, 15 in Egypt, and 15 in Lebanon.

Eight refugees died in Greece and 12 others in Turkey. Six more Palestinians were found dead in Malta, three in Palestine, three in Italy, and one refugee in Sweden. A Palestinian was, meanwhile, pronounced dead in Cyprus, another in Macedonia, and two more others in Germany.



At the same time, more than a dozen dead bodies have been recovered from a rubber dinghy crammed with 167 people off the coast of Libya.

Among the 13 dead, thought to be refugees fleeing bloody warfare, were pregnant women, according to Spanish rescue group Proactiva Open Arms.

The overcrowded boat was reportedly found drifting on 24 July near the people-smuggling hub of Sabratha, west of Libya.

Images from the boat show corpses lying on the deck, demonstrating the grim reality for migrants on the Mediterranean Sea. Rescuers said they heard children crying and calling out for their mothers as they boarded the boat.

Thousands of refugees, among them Palestinians, have died crossing the Mediterranean to Europe this year.

In another development, the Palestinian refugee from Syria Jihad Ata Dwei'er, a resident of Khan AlSheih Camp, was released from a Syrian government jail, where he had been held since June 10.

Newly-released Jihad was arrested by the Syrian government forces in Artouz, in Rif Dimashq on his way to take secondary school exams.

Meanwhile, three Palestinian students sheltered in Khan AlSheih have been enduring a mysterious fate in Syrian lock-ups.

Nizar Sa'id AlNader, Mahmoud Jamil Noufel, and Ahmed Mahmoud Ibrahim were kidnapped by the Syrian regime troops on June 4 on their way to Artouz to sit for secondary school exams.

In the meantime, the Palestine Charity Commission south of Damascus announced the launch of a series of protest events in response to the soaring Israeli violations at AlAqsa Mosque and against worshipers in Occupied Jerusalem.

The event is slated to take place on Thursday in Yalda town, adjacent to Yarmouk Camp, under the slogan "AlAqsa Shall Never Ever Be Closed."

•At least 3,540 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.

- •1,615 Palestinian refugees, including 101 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- •Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,462 days in a row.
- •196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- •Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,200 and 1,049 days.
- •Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,543 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 296 days.
- •Nearly 85,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria fled to Europe until the end of 2016.
- •31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- •17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- •6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- •8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- •1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
