Victims

The Palestinian Refugee Ahmed Shehada Abu Al Samak during participation in the ongoing conflict in Syria, he is from Al Sbeina camp and displaced to Danoun Camp in Damascus Suburb. It is referred that he is a member of one of the groups that are loyal to the Syrian Security. The AGPS documented about 66 victims from



the residents of Sbeina camp died during the war in Syria, moreover, 649 victims died due to fire shooting since the beginning of the war.

Recent Updates

The Syrian Security prevented the family of the Palestinian refugee Eweed Al Hasan to return back to their house at Al Husayneyya camp at Damascus Suburb and arrested a member of the family.

It is mentioned that the three brothers Ahmed, Mohammed and Ayman Eweed Al Hasan died due to torture in the Syrian prisons in charge of defection from the PLA. Some residents and activists accused the Syrian Regime forced at the Camp Checkpoint of detaining more than 20 people from Al Husaeneyya camp including women. It is noted that on 16th of August 2015, the Syrian Security allowed a number of families to return back to Al Husaeneyya camp.

The Syrian Army targeted the civilian houses at Khan Al Shieh camp yesterday with two mortar shells on the Schools Street, which led to fear and panic amongst residents and damages to a number of houses.


The bombing targeted Nestle crossing with two explosive barrels and the adjacent farms were targeted to a violent bombing with heavy artillery, where the roads are still that connect the between the camp and the surrounding areas except Zakia Khan Al Shieh camp.

In Damascus Suburb, the suffering of hundreds of the displaced Palestinian families, who were displaced from Yarmouk camp and other camps, was increased at Qudseya area due to the continuation of siege

that is imposed on this area by the Syrian Army since 23rd of July 2015. The siege was due to the kidnap one of the Syrian Security member by the Opposition groups, the siege was negatively reflected on the situation of the residents and the displaced Palestinian refugees and they suffer of securing the bread and food materials.

At Hama, the residents of Al Aedin camplive in a relatively calm state comparing to other Palestinian camps, the camp receives a big number of the displaced families from various camps and cities such as Aleppo, Idlib, Suburb, Hama, Deir Al Zoor, and Al Reqqa. The residents also suffer of the Strict Security Cordon on the entrances and exits of the camp and the arrest campaigns that the Regular Army carries once in a while. In terms of Economic side, the residents are complaining the spread of unemployment due to the deteriorated security situation, which affected the residents of the camp who most of the lost their work and they became dependent on the relief aid that are distributed in the camp.

Germany

News reports mentioned that The German Federal Office for Migration and Refugees (BAMF) has issued internal instructions suspending the Dublin procedure in respect of Syrian nationals. Under the Dublin Regulation, a Member State may make use of the "sovereignty clause" to voluntarily assume responsibility for processing asylum applications for which it is not otherwise responsible under the criteria of the Regulation.

According to the instructions, dated 21 August 2015, Dublin procedures that have already been initiated in relation to Syrians are to be cancelled,

in order for Germany to become the Member State responsible for processing their claims. This entails that enforceable return orders for Dublin transfers to other countries are also to be revoked. Newly applying Syrian and Palestinian Syrian asylum seekers are to be immediately channeled into the regular asylum procedure and will not be given the Dublin questionnaires usually provided to applicants, under the condition of proving by an ID or a Passport. The activists see that the German procedure is temporary to alleviate the pressure on the border areas which are crowded with thousands of immigrants especially from Syria, who escaped the ongoing war in Syria.



Immigrants crossing to Europe

Numbers and Statistics till 26/8/2015

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.

- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 785 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 855 days, water was cut for 345 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 180 victims.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 647 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 848 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 492 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jarmana, AL SaiedaZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
