Victims

Palestinian youth Mahmoud Abdullah Ibrahim, a resident of AlSayeda Zeinab Camp, died on Monday as he fought alongside the progovernment Abu AlAbd Nasser battalion in the environs of the shelter.

Several Palestinian youths have been forced to join pro-regime squads in their battles against the opposition outfits.



Latest Developments

Most of Syria's schools have been destroyed or put out of operation in the raging warfare, imperiling the education of the Syrians and Palestinians alike.

The Syrian warfare has contributed to a sharp nosedive in the rates of access to education, estimated at 75% in 2015, down from 95% prior to the conflict.

Violence has left only 42 out of 118 schools operational. Other students are being educated at 43 government schools, UNRWA added.

Concerns over abrupt abduction sweeps, torture, and enforced military conscription have led to a dramatic increase in school dropouts and children's access to education.

According to UNRWA, several Palestinian students dropped out of school as they sought livelihoods to help feeding and sheltering their impoverished families.



Meanwhile, 108 Palestinian refugees were executed since the outburst of the Syrian warfare, 89 among whom subjected to field executions, according to AGPS statistics until Tuesday, February 27.

The list of executed Palestinians included 17 conscripts at the Palestine Liberation Army (PLA) who were kidnapped in mid 2012 on their way back to AlNeirab Camp, in Aleppo, from a military site in Syria's northwestern city of Masyaf. The 17 fighters were reportedly killed by the Syrian government forces one month after their abduction.

AGPS found out that most of the executions were carried out by the different warring actors in Syria, including the regime troops and their

war abettors, along with the opposition battalions, AlNusra brigades, and ISIS militias.

The overall death toll among the Palestinians of Syria has hit 3,452, among whom women, children, toddlers, and elderly refugees.

Civil Action Commissions

The Jafra Foundation for Relief and Development in southern Damascus continues to deliver in-kind food items to the Palestinian families who were forcibly displaced from Yarmouk after ISIS grabbed hold of the camp in early April 2015.

Palestinian refugees stranded in Yarmouk and nearby towns have been enduring abject living conditions due to the tough blockade imposed by the regime army and the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,348 days in a row.

Palestinians of Syria: February 27, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,452 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,166 Palestinian refugees, including 83 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,348 days in a row.

- 190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,052 and 860 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,396 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 130 days.
- Government troops ban residents of AlSbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,201 days running.
- Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
