## **Victims**

Members of ISIS in the south of the capital Damascus, implemented a death sentence on Palestinian refugee "Moussa Al-Badawi" on Tuesday, in front of the Palestine Mosque in Yarmouk camp, for spying with Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham.



This is not the first time that ISIS has executed refugees from Yarmouk camp for spying with other parties. On 13-02-2017 executed Palestinian refugee, "Mohammed Attia," known as Hamouda Gezira, in Yarmouk camp for spying with "Aknaf Beit Al-Maqdes," after talks between him and the members of Beit Al-Maqdes were found on his phone.

On 02-03-2017, ISIS executed four refugees: Mohammed Nassar, a member of the Alyan family, another person from Al-Tayah family and two other refugees from Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham. On 07-03-2017, ISIS published pictures of the execution of Palestinian, "Mohammed Al-Tayeh, in the Orouba neighborhood in Yarmouk camp, for spying with Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham. One of the pictures showed that the victim had been beheaded.



## **Latest Developments:**

Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees in south Syria was bombarded last night, with a number of mortar shells, causing material damage.

Meanwhile, the residents of Deraa camp are suffering from extremely harsh living and health crises, especially with the ongoing water and electricity cuts from the camp, in addition to the extreme lack of medical supplies inside the camp, and the closure of most of the medical centers in the camp.

In another context, the residents of the Khan Danon camp are experiencing miserable living conditions, as a result of the shortage of the basic services inside the camp, where its residents are suffering from high prices, the lack of the basic services such as health, medicine and transportation, as well as the ongoing electricity, water and communication cuts for long periods of time.



Unemployment is also spreading among the residents of the camp, because of the tensined security state in Syria, making the assistance



provided by the relief organizations their only source to secure their basic needs.

The residents of Khan Danon camp, are complaining since the beginning of the Syrian war, of the unavailability of transportation means from and to the camp, which is located 23 km south of the capital Damascus. The movement to and from the Khan Danon camp is one of the significant problems facing its inhabitants. Any employee or student may wait several hours to get to work, in addition to other financial frustrations which could cost them half their salary or more, except for the drivers' moods.

In a similar context, the residents of Neirab camp for Palestinian refugees in Aleppo are complaining of suffocating living and economic conditions, due to the ongoing conflict in Syria, because of the expensive food supplies. The residents of the Neirab camp are also complaining of the suffocating transportation, because most of the buses and means of transportation have gone out of service, because of the lack of fuel and diesel and their high prices when they are available.

The lanes and alleys of the Neirab camp are witnessing the spread of motorcycles phenomenon, whose drivers are causing many severe road crashes.

Meanwhile, unemployment has forced a number of young men from the camp to accept any work opportunity, to guarantee any living expenses for them and their families. Many young men are volunteering in the popular committees and the Liwaa Al-Quds battalion, which is affiliated to the Syrian regime.



In another context, the Syrian security continues to detain Palestinian brothers, Mohammed Saleh Akawy, born in 1982 and Moaayad Saleh Akawy born in 1992, since December 2013. They were arrested at the Bateekha checkpoint at the beginning of Yarmouk camp, and no information has been revealed about their fate or detention conditions to this date.

The Syrian security detains many brothers and Palestinian families, including women and children, whose fate remains hidden to this date. A number of cases of siblings a families who have died due to torture in the Syrian regime's prisons have been recorded, such as the three brothers from the Hamdan family in Yarmouk camp, and the three sisters from the Saad Al-Din family in the Raml camp in Lattika, who died on 30-03-2015.

## Palestinians of Syria: February 26, 2018 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3661, including 465 women
- 1666 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,685 days in a row
- 205 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1421 days,
  and 161 days in Yarmouk Camp



- The Regime army has been in control of Handarat camp for more than 517 days. More than 80% of its buildings have been completely or partially destroyed.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
