Latest Developments

The Free Palestine Movement, affiliated with the Syrian government, announced the death of seven of its gunmen as they fought against opposition squads in the outskirts of the northern Syrian province of Idlib.

The victims are identified as: Anas Kanaa, Mahmoud AlHasan, Majed Weys, Mahmoud Kasas, Hasan AlAli, Amar Ghader, and Ihab Mohamed.

The so-called "Saraya Bader" group, the armed wing of the Free Palestine Movement, said it has been involved in pro-government battles in Syria in an attempt to held the Syrian government regain control over all corners of Idlib province.



Scores of Palestinian youths have been forced to join progovernment battalions in Syria. Those who refuse forced conscription are often subjected to manhunt and imprisonment. Thousands of young men have fled the country in the hunt for a safer shelter.

In another development, Palestinian refugees taking shelter in AlHusainiya refugee camp, in Rif Dimashq, have denounced the water blackout rocking the camp for months.



A Palestinian woman taking refuge in the area said water supplies have been cut in her neighborhood since last year.

The refugee appealed to the concerned authorities to take urgent action in response to the crisis and repair the water network at the soonest possible time.

A few days earlier, Palestinian refugees have voiced deep concern over the health hazards inflicted by the trash mounds piled up across residential alleyways and the standing wastewater flooding the main access roads in the camp.

All the way through the nine-year Syrian conflict, Palestinians taking refuge in AlHusainiya camp have been grappling with dire conditions. High unemployment rates and the absence of relief assistance by UNRWA and other humanitarian institutions have made survival quite difficult in the area.

In the meantime, Palestinian refugee Shahada Ahmad Habash, born in 1951, has been forcibly disappeared in Syrian government prisons since 2014.

The refugee was arrested on January 05, 2014, in Hjeira town, south of Damascus, as he attempted to flee the then-blockaded Yamrouk Camp.

AGPS documented the secret detention of 1,787 Palestinian refugees in Syria's state run penal complexes, among them 110 women and girls.

Meanwhile, AGPS documented the death of 82 Palestinian refugees taking shelter in AlSabina camp, in Rif Dimashq, since the outbreak of the deadly conflict in Syria.



The list includes 40 Palestinian refugees who died under shelling; 18 who were fatally gunned down, and six others who were shot dead by snipers.

Nine other Palestinians were also tortured to death; three died as a result of the blockade and medical neglect; two refugees died in car blasts; one refugee was subjected to extra-judicial execution, and another was killed by a white gun. Two Palestinian refugees died of unknown reasons.

AGPS data indicates that 4,027 Palestinian refugees from Syria died of war-related incidents since the outbreak of the bloody warfare.
